GENERAL RULES AND PROGRAM

First Games of Central-America

Under the auspices of Sr. Gral. D. Plutarco Elias Calles, constitutional president of the United States of Mexico, and the International Olympic Committee.

Mexico, from October 12th till November 2nd 1926

General Rules of the Games of Central-America

Approved in the meeting of the Congress of Central-America, authorized and patronised by the International Olympic Committee, at Paris, July 4th 1924.

Art. 1st. — Cuba, the Republic of Colombia, Mexico, Venezuela, the Republics of Central-America and Caribe, will organize every four years, starting from 1296, the **Games of «Central-America»** in which all athletes are allowed to participate who are registered as amateurs in conformity with the international rules of each sport.

These Games are placed under the patronage of the International Olympic Committee.

Art. 2. — THE GENERAL BOARD OF THE GAMES OF CENTRAL-AMERICA, is composed of four members of the NATIONAL COMMITTEE, elected by each country.

THE NATIONAL COMMITTEE is composed as follows:

One member of the National Olympic Committee;
One member representing the Government;
One member of the National Sports Confederation and One member of the International Olympic Committee.

Countries where there is no representative of the International Olympic Committee will have only three members.

Decisions are taken by majority of the votes polled, each country being entitled to one vote.

THE MANAGING COMMITTEE OF THE GAMES OF CENTRAL-AMERICA is composed as follows:

ONE TECHNICAL MANAGER appointed by the International Olympic Committee who will have a consultative voice but no right of voting.

FOUR MEMBERS OF THE NATIONAL COMMITTEE of the country that organizes the Games.

TWO DELEGATES appointed by the GENERAL BOARD OF THE GAMES OF CENTRAL AMERICA.

THE MANAGING COMMITTEE has the right to appoint such commissions or officials which are deemed necessary.

THE GENERAL BOARD OF THE GAMES OF CENTRAL AMERICA will indicate the country

where the Games will be organized and fix the date of same.

THE GENERAL BOARD OF THE GAMES OF CENTRAL AMERICA, will determine in their general program all those categories of sports and competitions which will be admitted to the Games.

THE GENERAL BOARD OF THE GAMES OF CENTRAL AMERICA, will appoint the three members of the jury, electing for this office neutral, authorized and honourable people.

Art. 3. — Rules will be the same as those for the Olympic Games, which are those of the International Federations.

Art. 4. — THE DELEGATE OF THE NATIONAL OLYMPIC COMMITTEE of the country which organizes the Games will be the CHAIRMAN OF THE GENERAL BOARD.

Art. 5. — The country which organizes the Games has to provide the guarantees necessary and will have to declare that it possesses the means necessary for the organization of the Games.

Art. 6. — All the participating countrys will have to pay their own travelling-expenses from one country to the other, as well as living-expenses of their delegations, however, the organizing country will afford them all possible accomodation.

Art. 7. — THE MANAGING COMMITTEE is bound to indicate all sports included in the Games, further hours and days and all details indispensable, useful or necessary in order to secure the best possible execution of the program.

Scale for classification of all competitors:

- a) 5 points to the winner.
- b) 4 points to the 2nd.
- c) 3 points to the 3rd.
- d) 2 points to the 4th.
- e) 1 point to the 5th.

For the relay-races these points are doubled.
