

Article 10. New:

(Earl Cadogan's Proposal) «To take decisions the I. O. C. must have a quorum of X... members present.»
N. B. — In accordance with Article 10 of the Statutes these modifications to be valid must be carried by two thirds of the votes of the members present when the voting takes place.

Article II. Necessary conditions for representing a country:

ADD, after nationality:

«An athlete who has made official application to change his nationality shall be considered as having renounced his original country and shall not be allowed to represent this country at the Olympic Games».

DAY AND TIME OF EACH COMPETITION

Saturday, 11th February, 1928

10 a. m.: Opening Ceremony immediately followed by First Hockey Match.

Afternoon: Two Hockey Matches.

Sunday, 12th February, 1928

8 a. m.: Ski, Military Team Race.

9 a. m.: Three Hockey Matches.

Afternoon: Horseracing on Snow.

Monday, 13th February, 1928

9 a.m. - 12 a. m.: Speed Skating, 500 metres. I or 2 hockey matches.

Afternoon: I or 2 hockey matches. Skating 5.000 metres.

Tuesday, 14th February, 1928.

9 a.m. - 12 a. m.: Speed Skating, 1500 metres. Figure skating, Ladies and men, set figures. I or 2 hockey matches.

Afternoon: Speed Skating, 10.000 metres. I or 2 hockey matches.

Wednesday, 15th February, 1928.

8 a. m.: Long Distance Ski Race.

Afternoon: Bobsleigh, 1st and 2nd heats.

Thursday, 16th February, 1928.

9 a.m. - 12 a. m.: Skeleton, 3 heats.

Afternoon: Figure Skating, pairs.

Friday, 17th February, 1928.

9 a. m.: Long Distance Race.

9 a.m. - 12 a.m.: Two hockey matches (semi-Finals)
Afternoon: Third and fourth Bobsleigh heats.

Saturday, 18th February, 1928.

All day: Ski Jumping.

Sunday, 19th February 1928.

Morning: Hockey match, final for 3rd and 4th places.

Afternoon: Hockey match, final for 1st and 2nd places.

Immediately after the Final: Closing ceremony of the Games. Announcement of results. Distribution of medals and diplomas.

According to circumstances (number of entries and atmospheric conditions) the Executive Committee of the IIInd Olympic Winter Games has the right to change the programme with the approval of the International Federations concerned and the Juries.
