Before leaving Los Angeles, the President of the I.O.C. tendered his thanks, in the name of his colleagues, to the Mayor of the City of Los Angeles, the Honorable John C. Porter, to President William May Garland, to the two Vice-Presidents, Messrs. Le Roy Sanders and Maynard McFie, and to the members of the Organizing Committee.

Anxious to offer a special token of gratitude to Messrs. Zack J. Farmer and H. O. Davis, Count de Baillet-Latour presented them with a souvenir medal as a token of his great appreciation for the manner in which they have served the Olympic cause.

The President of the I.O.C. together with members of the Executive Commission, summoned the delegates from the National Olympic Committees present in Los Angeles on Sunday, August 7th, in the morning, to discuss with them the current affairs.
