

OLYMPIC GAMES, LONDON 1948

Ticket organisation

The Organising Committee for the Olympic Games of London 1948 announces that the method of application and distribution of tickets will be on the following basis :

A percentage allocation will be made as between :

- (a) *Overseas applications through the respective National Olympic Committees ;*
- (b) *Applications for particular sports, from the respective Governing Bodies in the United Kingdom participating in the Games ;*
- (c) *Applications from the General Public.*

In making each percentage allocation, priority will be given to series bookings, which will consist of a full set of reserved tickets for all bookable sessions of any one sport. The allocation of tickets, other than for series bookings, will not be completed until after the allocation of the series bookings.

National Olympic Committees and the National Governing Bodies in the United Kingdom have been requested to submit their applications.

General public.

As regards applications from the general public, an announcement will be made in due course by the Olympic Box Office, Empire Stadium, Wembley, Middlesex, England.

It is, however, particularly stressed that NO APPLICATIONS should be made by the general public until this announcement is actually made.

Amendments to General Programme

(pp. 22-26 in C. I. O. Bulletin No. 6).

Basket Ball : August 6th—August 14th (not 13th).

Boxing : August 9th—August 13th (not 14th).

Cycling : The entries in individual events will be 2 per nation (not 3) and the competitors 1 per nation (not 2).

Fencing : The events will take place in the Palace of Engineering, Wembley.

Modern Pentathlon : July 30th—August 4th (not July 31st—August 5th).

All the events will take place at Aldershot, except the Shooting which will be at Bisley.

Shooting : The free rifle event will be shot at 300 metres if possible, or otherwise at 300 yards (not at 500 yards).

Weight-Lifting : The dates and venue for this event have not been finally settled.
