*The velodrome (cycling-track): This was built for the 1940 Games. It is situated at the north end of the city. The track is banked, of concrete and its highest declivity is 35 degrees. It holds 6000 spectators and during the Games will hold about 10 000.*

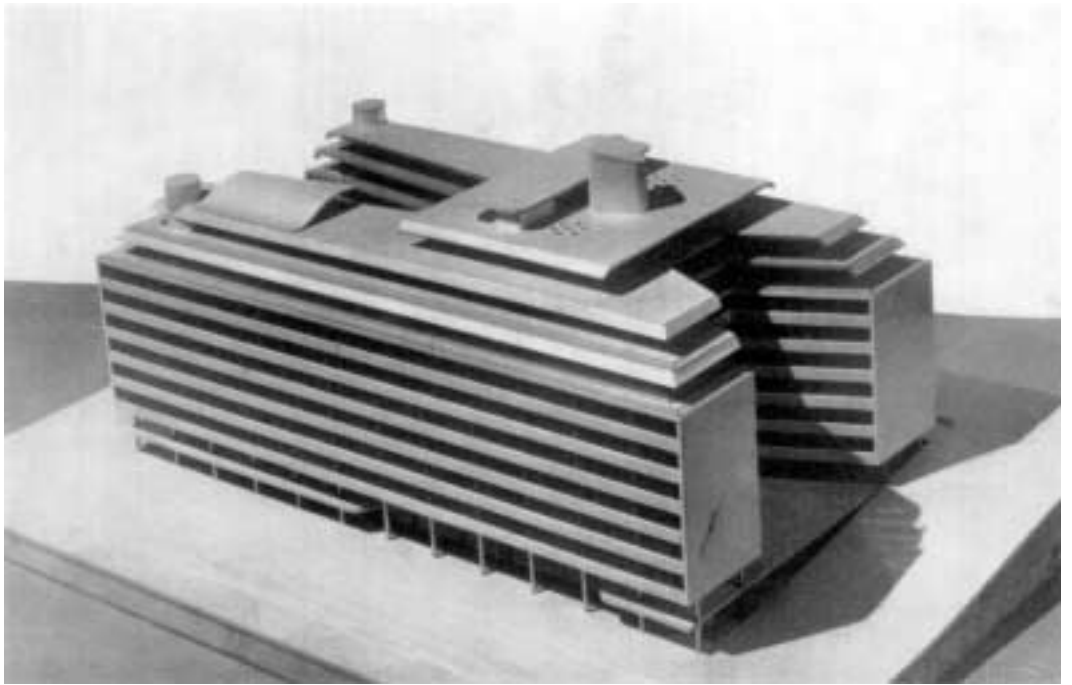
*The Olympic Stadium as it was in 1939. The upper part of the stand, which then was wooden, has now been pulled down and the permanent part of concrete has been enlarged to accomodate 60 000 spectators. The Organising Committee has planed to build wooden scaffoldings for a further 10 000 spectators.*



# INSTALLATIONS SPORTIVES D'HELSINKI



*The swimming stadium: This has been used since 1947, but will be completely ready in 1950. There is a 50 metres pool and a separate diving pool with an up-to-date diving tower. The swimming stadium will accommodate 10 000 spectators.*



The miniature of the new Industrial Palace: *The erection has already started and will be finished in 1952. The building is situated opposite to the southern harbor of the town. There will be 450 office-rooms and a first class hotel with 60 rooms. The I. O. C.-members will be accommodated in this hotel. The office-rooms will be furnished for temporary quartering for representatives of different national Olympic Committees and international federations.*

The exhibition hall: *This is the largest indoor contest ground. It is very near the Olympic Stadium. It holds 7000 spectators, but the planned 2-store stands will increase the number of seats to over 10 000.*
