

## **Exhibition of national sporting trophies**

*in London, from April to October 1951*

The Exhibition of National Sporting Trophies to be opened at Hudchinson House in London, formerly the London home of the late Lord Derby, on April 23d next will constitute one of the most interesting attractions for visitors from Overseas and the sporting public generally during the period of the Festival of Great Britain. There will be on view Cups and Trophies of all shapes and sizes with an entertaining history and many of which the sporting enthusiast rarely has had an opportunity of seeing at close quarters. About five hundred trophies will be displayed. It is, therefore, with genuine pleasure that H. R. H. The Duke of Edinburgh, K. G. as President and Lord

Aberdare of Duffryn, C. B. E. (member of the I. O. C.) as Chairman, have so closely co-operated with other members of the General Council amongst whom we find also the name of Lord David Burghley, K. C. M. G., member of the I. O. C. and many other gentlemen who have been prominently identified in promoting, and preserving, the best interest of National and International Sport, with the sole object of making the Exhibition a complete success. Any profits which may accrue from those joint efforts will be devoted to the real needs of Sporting Organisations which will be universally agreed as a most laudable purpose.
