

Circular letter to National Olympic Committees

(Copies to I. O. C. Members from Avery BRUNDAGE, president.)

The venue for both the Games of the XVII Olympiad and the VIII Winter Games (in the year 1960) will be determined at the Paris session of the International Olympic Committee, June 14-17, 1955. Candidatures may be presented by a National Olympic Committee on behalf of a city or by the interested city itself.

You have already received pamphlets, entitled « Information for Cities which desire

to stage the Olympic Games », and a questionnaire that must be answered for the information of the I. O. C.

Replies to the questionnaire must be in the hands of the Chancellor before March 1, 1955, and the I. O. C. should be notified at that time if a delegation will be sent to present the invitation in person, so that a definite time may be fixed for its appearance.
