

ENTENTE BETWEEN THE TWO NATIONAL OLYMPIC COMMITTEES OF GERMANY

As a result of the decision taken by the I. O. C. in Paris, by which a provisional recognition was granted to the Olympic Committee of the Peoples Democratic Republic of Germany (East) on the understanding that only one German team be participating in the Melbourne Games of 1956, the two German Olympic Committees (East and West) met in conference near Friburg en Brisgau on the 27th and 28th of August 1955.

The Olympic Committee of West Germany was represented by : Dr. Karl Ritter von Halt,

Dr. Willy Daume and Dr. P. Bauwens.

The Olympic Committee of the East was represented by : Mr. Heinz Schöbel, President, Mr. Günter Heinze and Mr. Rudi Reichert.

An understanding was reached on various points, each Committee showing obviously an eager desire to meet with the I. O. C.'s wishes. The appointed date for the next Conference which is to be held in Berlin (East) has been fixed for November 12th and 13th, 1955.
