

Mr. R. S. Alexander, president of the Olympic Committee for Kenya, in one of his letters, relates a peculiar occurrence which we believe to be unique in the annals of the Olympic Games. As it happened, the olympic team sent up by Kenya was made up of athletes belonging to the three most important races of the world : Asiatics, Africans and Europeans. The harmony between these athletes was perfect, which does prove that with some good-will and give and take one ought to be able to reach a friendly understanding in this world. We can thus state that the Olympic Games have once more given a striking proof that all the races of the world can uphold the same ideals and learn

to appreciate each other while competing for the same aim. This fact was worth mentioning, especially as the team from Kenya was the cynosure of all eyes during the parade of the athletes at the Opening Ceremony.
