César Bonacossa : *La Vie au Soleil*, by Albert Bonacossa.

De Luxe edition, including 16 inset plates, 190 pages, published in Italian. The president of the International Olympic Committee made the following comments on this book :

"This biography of this great sportsman, written by his son, describes also the history of sport in Italy over a period of 50 years."

De Luxe edition, bound in linen, 245 pages 12 inset plates. This work is compiled by the son of the late Count Bonacossa, who was a most devoted and influential member of the International Olympic Committee. It is the result of extensive investigations made in India, the extreme north of Himalaya, Ceylon, the whole of Japan, Thailand, Hong-Kong, the isle of Bali and Malay. This work has been commended by the Jury of the Viareggio Prize, 1956. It is published in Italian.

XVith Olympiad 1956. Olympische Sommerspiele 1956 in Melbourne. Von Robert Lembke, Herbert Zimmermann and Gerd Mehl.

The editor, Wilhem Limpert-Verlag, Frankfurt am Main, Germany, has presented the Olympic Library of Mon-Repos, at Lausanne, with a magnificent book, a compilation which he devotes entirely to the Melbourne Games. Fully illustrated with very comprehensive plates, this work devotes one chapter to each sport along with the annotated results indicating the names of the first three winners in each event. This publication has 160 pages, with linen cover its cost is 17 D.M., with coloured plastic jacket, its cost is 20 D.M. A separate supplement gives the comparative results and the names of the first three winners at the following Games : Olympic Games at Athens, 1896, London 1948, Helsinki 1952 and Melbourne 1956.
