Landmans' Editions (Corso Vittorio Emanuele 22, Milano) have sent to the Olympic Museum their 1957 specialized catalogue *Sixty Years of the History of Sport Stamps* written in five languages, Italian, French, German, English and Spanish. Very handsomely bound, this catalogue contains the descriptions, reproductions and value in liras of all sport and Olympic stamps, aviation stamps included. This catalogue is a reliable and accurate guide for the stamp-lovers who specialize sport-stamps issues. Its price is 2000 liras or 4 dollars, plus postage.
