**CANDIDATURES
OF CITIES WHICH DESIRE TO STAGE THE GAMES
OF THE XVIIIth OLYMPIAD IN 1964**

Dear Sirs,

We beg to ask you to invite the City of your country wishing to organize the Games of the XVIIIth Olympiad *in 1964* to present his candidature to the

International Olympic Committee

LAUSANNE (Switzerland)

before December 1st 1958.

according to the enclosed rules of which we let you have two copies. Supplementary copies will be sent on request.

Invitations to stage the Games must be endorsed by the National Olympic Committee of the country in which the city is located, and only one invitation from a country will be considered.

If there should be more than one candidate in a country the National Olympic Committee will choose that one whose invitation has to be forwarded to the International Olympic Committee.

Invitations must have the approval of the Government of the country in which the city is located in order to ensure its cooperation in staging the Games successfully.

The vote on the choice of the city who will stage the Olympic Games in 1964 will take place at our Session of 1959 in a neutral city whose country has no candidate.
