

*Alternate transportation and housing Plan,
presented at Tokyo - May 1958*

I. *Are included in the Plan:*

A. All participating athletes.

Ail athletes that are accredited by the National Olympic Committee of their respective country in accordance with International Olympic Committee rules.

B. All National Olympic Committee and International Federation officials covered by Olympic Rules 36 and 38.

Those officials as certified by the respective National Olympic Committees based on the formula set up under Rule 36 *a, b, c, d* and *e* will be included. Under Rule 38, those included will be the necessary officials and a jury for each sport that are appointed by the International Federations participating in the VIIIth Olympic Winter Games only.

II. *Transportation provided*

A. Each National Olympic Committee or International Federation will provide transportation for its participating athletes and officials to San Francisco and return.

Each National Olympic Committee and International Federation will arrange transportation for its participating athletes and officials to San Francisco and return. The necessary tickets to accomplish this transportation will be paid for by the National Olympic Committees and International Federations. Since the Organizing Committee will not pay for this transportation, it will not be necessary for each National Olympic Committee and International Federation to deposit 500 U.S. dollars per athlete and official.

B. The Organizing Committee will provide at its expense round trip transportation, including baggage, between San Francisco and Squaw Valley.

This transportation will be provided at no cost to all accredited athletes and all National Olympic Committee and International Federation officials covered by Olympic Rules 36 and 38, as outlined in Paragraphs I, A and B, above.

III. *Housing and board provided*

A. The cost of room and board at Squaw Valley for all participating athletes and officials is included for the period starting a maximum of 10 days prior to the opening of the Games and extending through the closing of the Games.

1. The Organizing Committee will pay for the cost of room and board from 8 February 1960 through and including 28 February 1960.

2. The Organizing Committee, at its sole discretion, may extend this period after 28 February 1960 as needed in the event of necessary postponement of the Games. The Organizing Committee will pay the cost of any additional room and board caused by "such postponement.

3. The cost of any additional room and board for periods not covered above must be paid for by the individual or his organization at a rate not to exceed \$12.00 per day per person. A deposit will be required for any such additional room and board. An information letter will be sent to each National Olympic Committee and Federation which will include the amount of deposit, deposit date, as well as other details concerning the housing portion of this Plan.

IV. *Cost of the Plan*

Transportation to San Francisco and return will be paid for by each National Olympic Committee and International Federation concerned. Transportation from San Francisco to Squaw Valley and return, including baggage, will be paid for by the Organizing Committee. The Organizing Committee will pay the cost of room and board from 8 February 1960 through 28 February 1960 for those participating in the Plan. Under this Plan, it will not be necessary for the National Olympic Committees and International Federations to make the deposit of 500 U.S. dollars per participant.

V. *General conditions*

Each National Olympic Committee and International Federation must notify the Organizing Committee by 31 December 1958 whether it prefers the Original Transportation and Housing Plan presented at Sofia or the Alternate Transportation and Housing Plan presented at Tokyo. The Organizing Committee will present the preferences of the National Olympic Committees and International Federations to the next meeting of the International Olympic Committee Executive Board for its consideration. Following the decision of the Executive Committee, the Organizing Committee will advise each National Olympic Committee and International Federation of the implementing details.
