

## **A COMMEMORATIVE TABLET AT THE SORBONNE**

At the Munich Session, Mr. Armand Massard, Vice-President of the International Olympic Committee and President of the French Olympic Committee, announced that he obtained leave from the competent authorities to insert a commemorative tablet in the Sorbonne. It will commemorate the place where Baron de Coubertin revived the Olympic Games of the Modern Era. It was, indeed, in the great amphitheatre at the Sorbonne, that, in June 23rd, 1894, in front of an audience of over 2,000 people, the decision to revive the Olympic Games was unanimously adopted by the representatives of 12 European countries as well as the United States which were attending the Congress. On that same day, the Assembly appointed the International Olympic Committee which still remains in charge of the development of the Olympic Movement.
