



Tokyo Games First Bulletin

The first Bulletin of the Games of the XVIIIth Olympiad, Tokyo 1964 has just come out. Admirably presented, the cover of this very fine publication illustrates Mount Fuji which is known as the symbol of Japan throughout the world. This first impression contains various messages: one from Mr. Avery Brundage, president of the International Olympic Committee, also from Mr. Juichi Tsushima, president of the Organizing Committee, and a message from Dr. Ryotaro Azuma, Governor of the city of Tokyo and member of the Executive Board of the International Olympic Committee. Fully illustrated, this Bulletin gives

the list of the members of the Organizing Committee and it also publishes the letter Baron Pierre de Coubertin wrote in connection with the celebration of the Games which had been allotted to the city of Tokyo charged with staging the XIIth Olympiad in 1940. These Games were cancelled on account of the outbreak of the Second World War.

We acknowledge this first publication which is to be followed by other reports in view of keeping us regularly informed as to the progress of the Tokyo Games organization. We wish to express our best wishes for the success of these Games.
