

The Olympic Village

The name is deceptive - the *Olympic Village* of the years following the war, when sportsmen were housed in cottages set in fields and

birchwoods, has given place to an Olympic town. Nothing of the former 'village' remains except that participants to the Games are accommodated in a separate housing complex for themselves. This is the ideal form of accommodation during Olympic Games and one which is best worth achieving. In Innsbruck, therefore, it is not intended to house the competitors in hotels as was still done at Cortina. Active participants at the

IX. Olympic Winter Games 1964, in Innsbruck, will take up quarters in comfortable modern flats, in 8 apartment houses, 10 stories high.
