The Carl-Diem Institute in Cologne has just published at Olympischer Sport-Verlag, the "Olympic Idea", a collection of speeches and essays by Pierre de Coubertin. This volume contains a particularly fine selection of articles, speeches and lectures by the reviver of the Olympic Games, showing his different opinions and the development of his ideas. This collection, which has a preface by President Avery Brundage and Mr. Willi Daume, President of the German Olympic Committee and member of the I.O.C. for Germany, ends with a very full bibliography of Pierre de Coubertin's writings from 1886 to 1937, the year of his death. No less than two hundred and twenty-six sports, pedagogical, historical, geographical and political works are listed there. This list will be invaluable for all those writing theses on the Coubertinian philosophy or who, quite simply, are interested in his work. Thus, as Avery Brundage writes in his preface, the Carl-Diem Institute deserves the warmest congratulations for the important work of research undertaken and completed with so much intelligence.
