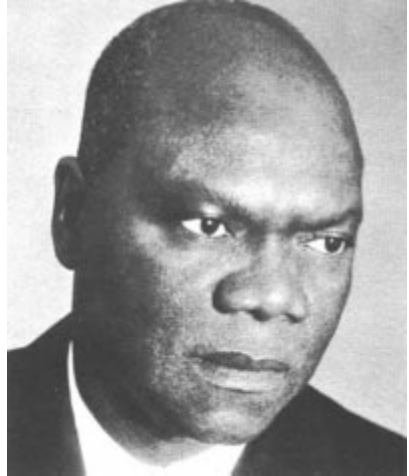


NEWS ABOUT MEMBERS OF THE IOC

- *The death of Mr. Amadou BARRY.* The meeting of the Executive Board was drawing to an end when a telegram was handed to Mr. Avery BRUNDAGE, President of the I.O.C. informing him of the death at Bordeaux Hospital in Dakar of the President of the Senegalese Olympic Committee, Mr. Amadou BARRY, who had been a member of the I.O.C. since 1965.

Right away, all members of the I.O.C. attending the meeting at Vidy sent a telegram of condolence to the deceased's family.



Mr. Amadou BARRY was born on the 15th November, 1904 at St. Louis in Senegal. Head of the Senegalese Railways, he later became deputy mayor of the town of Goree; he was President of the Finance and Economic Affairs Committee in the Senegal National Assembly.

- *Mr. Hugh WEIR*, a member of the I.O.C. who came to Lausanne as personal assistant to the President of the I.O.C., had to return to Australia for an operation. All those who have had the pleasure of meeting him and appreciating his qualities join us in wishing him a speedy recovery.

- *H.E. Mohammed TAHER*, a member of the I.O.C. since 1934, left Geneva a few months ago to live in Istanbul.

- *Mr. Erik von FRENCKELL*, a member of the I.O.C. for Finland since 1948, confided in us that he has attended all the Olympic Games without exception since those of 1912, including - naturally - the Helsinki Games at which he was President of the Organizing Committee of the XVth Olympiad. Like him, we feel that there must be very few who share this privilege.

- *Dr. Ryotaro AZUMA*, *President of the Japanese Ski Association*. This appointment of Dr. R. AZUMA, who has been a member of the I.O.C. for Japan since 1950, and whose work as Governor of Tokyo at the time of the Tokyo Olympics was unanimously appreciated, will undoubtedly contribute greatly to the success of the Sapporo Winter Olympic in 1972.
