International Amateur Athletic Federation

* We hereby inform you of the recent publication of the Year Book of the *International Amateur Athletic Federation*. In addition to the rules and regulations of the International Federation, this book contains the list of affiliated national federations, currently numbering 141, world records and the results of the Mexico Games. * The Committee of this federation, meeting in London, decided to submit a proposal to this federation's Congress, which will assemble in Munich at the time of the Olympic Games. This proposal suggests that the best indoor performances should not be included in the official list of world records if they are set on tracks of less than 220 yards. At present, indoor records are not called records but best world performances.

the following minimum qualifying
weights for athletes chosen to
take part in the Olympic Games
in Munich:

Fly: 297.5 kg; Bantam: 322.5 kg;
Feather: 355 kg; Light: 390 kg;
Middle: 425 kg; Middle-heavy:
435 kg; Heavy: 475 kg; Super-
heave: 487.5 kg.
