

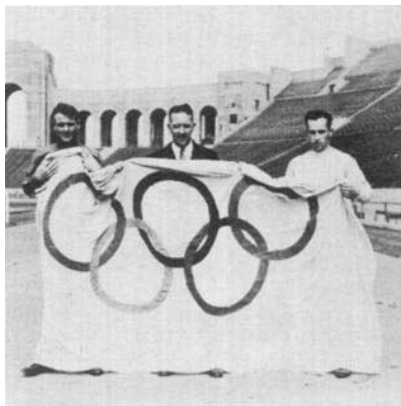

BEHIND THE HEADLINES WITH BILL HENRY published by Patricia Henry YEOMANS. *The Ward Ritchie Press, Los Angeles, California.*

In this book, Patricia Henry YEOMANS has collected articles, radio broadcasts, speeches, essays and letters of Bill HENRY, celebrated American sports and political journalist. Equally at ease on a playing field as at a White House Reception, he was also interested in aviation, and, thanks to his help, Donald DOUGLAS, founder of the celebrated aeronautics firm, was able to find the necessary funds to build his first aeroplane.

Between 1928 and 1932, he worked as sports technical advisor for the Organising Committee of the Xth Olympiad in Los Angeles. It is to him that we owe the reports on the Berlin Games (1936), published in the "Los Angeles Times". When war broke out in 1939, he was in Helsinki, reporting on the preparations for the 1940 Games. European War Correspondent, then in the South Pacific in 1942, he went back to Washington in 1943, where he specialised in American politics and was close to the presidents and diplomats.

In 1948, he was back to London as a special reporter and his reports on the Olympic Games earned him a prize for journalism.

Right up to the time of his death, at the age of 67 in 1970, he was passionately interested in his country's politics and never ceased to write full of humour, lively and well-documented articles, which you can read with pleasure and interest in this book published by Patricia Henry YEOMANS.

The Italian National Olympic Committee has just published, as it does after every Games, a report on the 1968 Games. Very well presented, this work contains a list of the Italian athletes who took part in Grenoble and Mexico and their performances and also the complete results of each event. In addition, you will find, as an annex, the names of the first four in each sport and in the art competition, for all the Summer and Winter Olympic Games from 1896 to 1968. This reference book, published with the

care of Donato MARTUCCI, Head of the CONI Press Department, is a must for the library of all those interested in sport.
