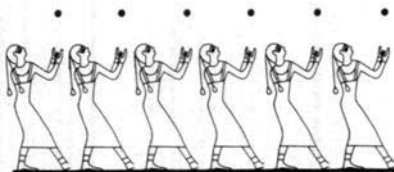
FEDERATION INTERNATIONALE DES SOCIETES D'AVIRON

* The Rotsee regata was held in Lucerne on 7th, 8th and 9th July, before a crowd of 20,000 people. This annual international competition formed the trials for the coming Olympic Games and many teams were selected on their performances at these events.



FEDERATION INTERNATIONALE DE BASKETBALL AMATEUR

* The "Fédération Internationale de Basketball Amateur" has celebrated its 40th birthday. In fact, this Federation was created on 18th June, 1932 in Geneva. The celebration on 18th June, was in the form of a brilliant reception held in the Geneva Grand Theatre and attended by four of the founder members, Messrs. Léon BOUFFARD, William JONES (present Secretary General), Maurice ABRAMOWICZ and MAROSKOUFIS.



During this meeting, the groups and meetings of the last pre-Olympic tournament in Augsburg were drawn by lot.

* The draw by lot of the groups for the Olympic Games basketball tournaments was held recently in Munich and the following were the results:

Group-A: Australia, Brazil, Cuba, Czechoslovakia, Egypt, Japan, United States.

Group B: Germany, Philippines, Puerto-Rico, Senegal, U.S.S.P., Yugoslavia.

Two nations have still to be chosen from the preliminary rounds in Augsburg, which will be held from 11th to 19th August, when fifteen nations will be competing: Belgium, Bulgaria, Canada, D.P.R. Korea, Finland, Great Britain, Greece, Israel, Mexico, Netherlands, Poland, Republic of China, Spain, Sweden, Switzerland.

* The first world mini-basket jamboree took place from 5th to 12th July in Aguadulce (Spain). This championship, for children from 8 to 12 years old, was a great success.

UNION INTERNATIONALE DE TIR

* According to the IOC rules, the anti-doping controls will be applied to competitors in the shooting events. The technical committee of the "Union Internationale de Tir" would like to see a modification: the control to be given to six competitors chosen by lot before the competition and not to the Olympic medalists.



* The Third European Air Rifle Championships will be held in Great Britain in 1974.
