Olympic Games, Munich 1972. Issue: 15th March 1973 at Brazzaville. Three values: 100 F., hurdles (violet, plum and geranium); 150 F., pole-vault (amethyst and silk green); 250 F., wrestling (fuchsia and royal blue). Design: Dessirier. Engraving: (100 and 150 F.) Claude Jumelet, (250 F.) Larrivière.

### Cuba

Sports posters. Issue: 22nd December 1972. Seven values: 1 c., 10th National Schools Sports Games; 2 c., athletics; 3 c., amateur baseball; 4 c., wrestling; 5 c., fencing; 13 c., boxing; 30 c., national sea-pike tournament, Ernest Hemingway. Design: A. Franca.

Medals won at the Olympic Games, Munich 1972. Seven values: 1 c., athletics, 100 m.; 2 c., athletics, 4 x 100 m.; 3, 4, 5, 13 and 30 c., boxing. Block of 50 c.: basketball. Design: M. Duran.

### Cyprus

29th Congress of the Fédération Internationale de Ski. Issue: 13th March 1973. Two values: 20 m., countryside; 100 m., emblem of the congress.

### Czechoslovakia

Sports – various subjects. Issue: 22nd February 1973. Three values: 30 h., tennis (Design: I. Strnad – Engraving: J. Mracek); 60 h., skating (Design: A. Podzemka – Engraving: J. Schmidt); 1 K., 3rd Summer Spartakiad.

### Fiji

60th anniversary of the Fiji Rugby Union. Issue: 9th March 1973. Three values: 2, 8 and 25 c.

### Haiti

Olympic Games, Munich 1972. Issue: 10th January 1973. Ten values: 5, 10, 20, 25, 50, 75 c. and 1.50, 2.50, 5 G. Each stamp is printed with an adjoining vignette.

### Hungary

Medals won at the Olympic Games, Munich 1972. Issue: 31st March 1973. Seven values (airmail): 40 f., riding (gold); 60 f., weightlifting (gold); 1 F., canoe (silver); 1.20 F., swimming (silver); 1.80 F., boxing (gold); 4 F., wrestling (gold); 6 F., fencing (gold). Printing: 590,000 per series. Block of 10 F. (airmail): 355,000. Design: L. Dudas.

### Liberia

Olympic Games, Munich 1972. Issue: 5th January 1973. Six values: 5 c., Klaus Dibiasi, diving; 8 c., Valeri Borzov, athletics; 10 c., Hideki Yanagida, wrestling; 12 c., Mark Spitz, swimming; 15 c., Kipehogi Keino, athletics; 25 c., Richard Meade, riding. Block of 55 c., Hans Günther Winkler, riding. Design: V. Whiteley.

### Monaco

150th anniversary of the creation of rugby by William Webb. Issue: May 1973. One value: 0.90 F. (red lilac, grey lilac and carmine brown). Design-engraving: Pierre Forget.

### New Zealand

Olympic Games, Munich 1972. Issue: 7th February 1973. One value: 8 c., canoe. Design: B. Langford.

### Nigeria

African Games at Lagos. Issue: 8th January 1973. Four values: 5 K., athletics; 12 K., football; 18 K., table-tennis; 25 K., Surulere stadium.

### Panama

7th Bolivarian Sports Games. Issue: 10th February 1973. Six values (airmail): 8 c., 10 c., basketball; 13 c., flame; 25 c., boxing; 50 c., Simon Bolivar, the Isthmus of Panama and the Panama flag; 1 B., medals. Printing: 500,000 series (8, 10, 13 and 25 c.)—100,000 series (50 c. and 1 B.).

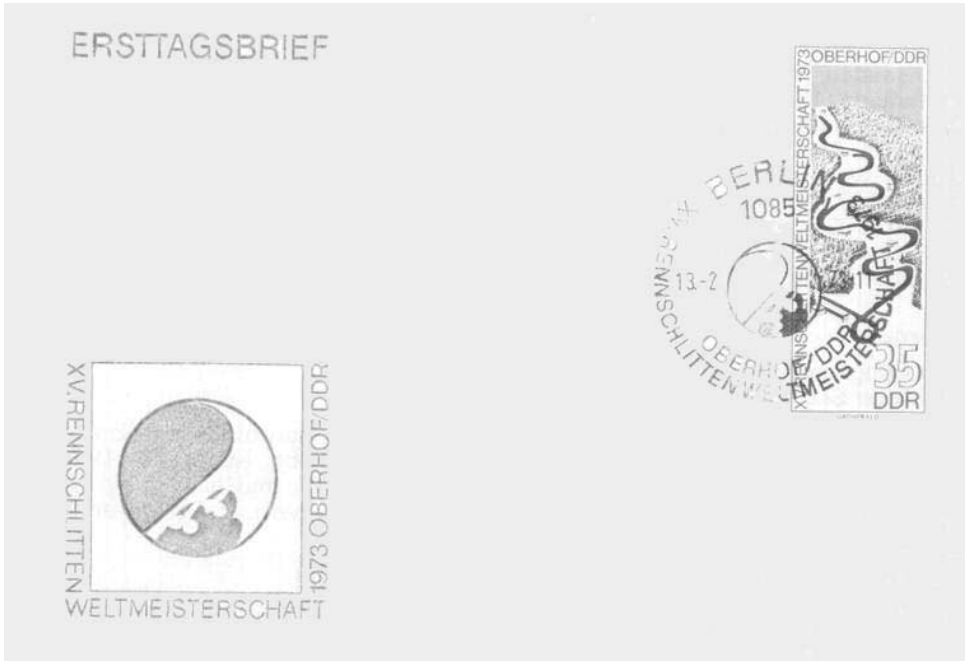
### French Polynesia
