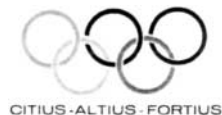

- At its meeting on 20th February the Administration Council of the CNOSF decided to award the French Olympic medallists, through the intermediary of the Association of French Olympic Medallists, with a special card entitling them to attend the sports meetings organised by the affiliated federations.

- The "Stade Français", one of the finest multi-sports clubs in Paris, celebrates its nintieth anniversary. A special edition of its review "Bleu et Rouge" ("Blue and Red") traces the history of this club which was created in 1883 and which Pierre de Coubertin, whom no sporting event left indifferent, helped on its way. A complete balance sheet for each sport recalls the club's famous names and dates.

Great Britain

New Zealand

Finally the last page reports on the general assembly of the "Türkiye Milli Olimpiyat Komitesi" which took place on 30th March, attended by the 14 members of the Executive Committee, representatives of the affiliated national federations and other members.

Turkey



- A little while ago Mr. Haluk San, member of the Turkish NOC's Executive Committee, paid a visit to the Japanese Olympic Committee, at which he and Mr. Hanji Aoki, President of the JOC exchanged flags.
- Bulletin No. 10 of the "Türkiye Millî Olimpiyat Komitesi" publishes a very interesting and well documented article on the birth of modern Olympism and the 1st Congress at Paris in 1894. In comparison Mr. Suat Erler, IOC member, has taken care of the translation into Turkish of the presentation of the Varna Congress which was published in No. 60-61 of the Olympic Review.

Another article is devoted to the choice of Innsbruck for the 1976 Winter Games, replacing Denver.

USSR



- By 15th April, 57 countries had informed the Organising Committee of their intention to participate in the Universiade, which will be held in Moscow from 15th to 25th August 1973.
- Profiting from the presence in Moscow on this occasion of a great number of volleyball referees, an international seminar will be held from 12th to 18th August, intended for judges in the national category and sanctioned by the title "candidate referee in the international category".
- In order to prepare for this Universiade, the Organising Committee has just published a technical and general ruling in Russian, English and French. It is valuable for anyone who wants to know more about student sport and indispensable for anyone who practises it.
