* 2nd Olympic series. Montreal 1976. Issue: 22nd March 1974. Four values: 8c: diving; 8c: mountain tour; 8c: family on bicycles; 8c: jogging. Design: Ste Hunter Straker, from photographs by C. McNeill. A special printing technique has been used for this series. Apart from the image on the stamp, another design—the Olympic emblems—appears when you look at the stamp from a particular angle.

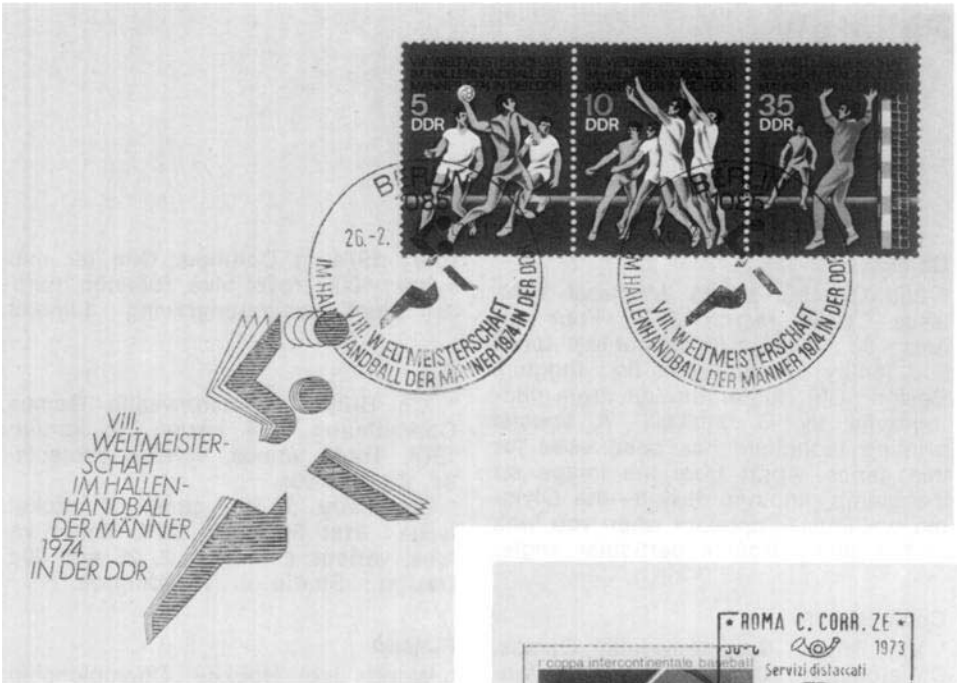
