

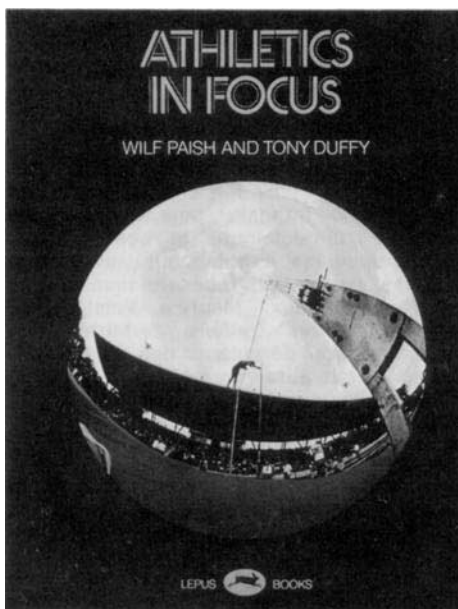

ATHLETICS IN FOCUS, by Tony Duffy and Wilf Paish. Published by Lepus Books, 106 Hampstead Road, London NW1 2LS (England). 1976, 164 pages, in English. Price: £5.85.

It would have been difficult to find two men better qualified than Wilfred Paish and Tony Duffy to bring out this marvellous book devoted to athletics. Tony Duffy, who won the "Sports Photographer of the Year" award in 1975, is one of the best present-day sports photographers. His works are illustrated in the world's biggest sports newspapers and magazines, while Wilfred Paish, a national coach, has trained several high level athletes in all athletics disciplines and at present is the official trainer of the British team for Montreal. Their collaboration has permitted the creation of this work which is at the same time open in form and of rare complexity, both emotional on account of the choice of photographs, and technical in Paish's art of grasping and reporting on the essence of an athletics discipline, or one of the sports problems caused by medicine, politics, heredity, altitude, etc.

HOW TO WATCH THE OLYMPIC GAMES - Summer 1976, the ABC/Montreal Star/New York Times complete guide. Published by Optimum Publishing Company Ltd., 245 rue Saint-Jacques. Montreal H2Y 1M6, Quebec, Canada. 1975, 299 pages, in English.

This very complete guide presents each sport on the Montreal programme with the help of photographs, pictures and diagrams enabling the basic rules to be understood, and also includes the history, the methods of qualification and the table of all the champions of the Olympic Games of the modern era.



THE PRINCIPLES AND PROBLEMS OF COACHING, compiled by John D. Massengale. Published by Charles C. Thomas, Bannerstone House, 301-327 East Lawrence Avenue, Springfield, Illinois, USA. 1975, 378 pages, in English.

Fifty qualified authors have pooled their knowledge and experience to produce a work primarily for coaches, teachers and students intending to be coaches. Divided into eight sections dealing with the trainer's different attitudes towards problems of coaching, teaching, relations with the student body, and other trainers, coaching methods of the athlete and the team, and psychology.

The variety and number of authors enables all these problems to be looked at from a less dogmatic angle and gives a kaleidoscope of opinions and points of view which help to pinpoint the reality of the coach's function.

SPORT ET LES JEUX OLYMPIQUES (Sport and the Olympic Games), by Maurice Vidal. Published by La Farandole, 11 bis, rue de la Planche, 75007 Paris (France), 1976, 206 pages, in French.

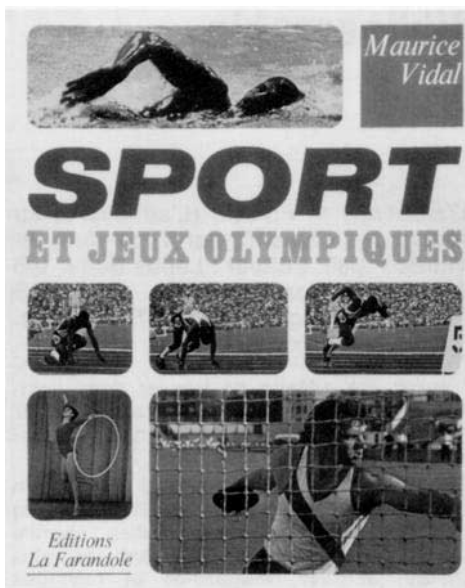
The work of one of the best sports journalists, this book is primarily intended for French readers but will also enlighten and give its particular opinions to anyone who takes the trouble to read it. Apart from the national angles, Maurice Vidal has managed to grasp and explain certain little known or confusing aspects of the Olympic Games. He also does justice to certain prejudices or ready made expressions relating to sport before giving his deep beliefs in the form of a short satirical lexicon. Although he only deals with the most recent Olympiads, certain passages are well worth reading.

PURNELL'S ENCYCLOPAEDIA OF SPORT, by Norman Barrett. Published by Purnell Books, Berkshire House, Maidenhead, Berks (England). 1974, 256 pages, in English. Price: £3.25.

Written in collaboration by sixteen authors headed by Norman Barrett and with a foreword by Dr. Roger Bannister, Chairman of the Sports Council of Great Britain, this book presents over a hundred sports or sporting activities from the most popular and attractive down to the least known or practised. Wonderfully illustrated with many interesting documents, each sport is presented with its history, its rules, its records, its feats and its heroes, thus enabling the reader to form an idea of each game's atmosphere and spirit and to become well acquainted with world sport.

LA BOXE LIBRE (Free boxing) by Marc Carl Peila. Publishers Edition Chiron, rue de Seine 40, 75006 Paris, France. 1975, 72 pages, in French. Price: 30 French francs.

Derived from the Oriental martial arts and Western combat techniques, like savate, free



boxing has had its own federation since 1972. This difficult sport is presented here in a very clear and attractive manner by its creator, Mr. Carl Peila.

OLYMPIC HANDBOOK, by Ron Pickering. Published by Macmillan London Ltd., London (England) and Macmillan Company of Canada Ltd., 70 Bond Street, Toronto, Ontario (Canada). 1976, 126 pages, in English. Price: Great Britain: £1.95; Australia: \$4.50; New Zealand: \$4.95.

A very popular and respected sports commentator, Ron Pickering will be covering his seventh Olympic Games at Montreal. This handbook contains all the data necessary to understand the Olympic Games well, enabling those who can only follow them in front of the television to find the record, name or ruling which interests them quickly and easily. As usual Tony Duffy's photographs are remarkable and add an additional dimension to this work.

LEXIQUE DE L'HOMME DE CHEVAL (The Horseman's Lexicon), by M. de Saint-Riquier and Dr. J. Delporte. Published by Amphora, 14, rue de l'Odéon, 75006 Paris, France. 200 pages, in French. 1975.

The horse from A to Z, claims the sub-title. It indeed appears that nothing has been forgotten in this collection of expressions, words and terms referring to the quadruped, and the definitions given are a good example of conciseness and simplicity. Glancing through this book one has a chance to enrich one's knowledge and vocabulary, and hence better understand the horseman's world.

THE AFRICAN RUNNING REVOLUTION, compiled by Dave Prokop. Published by Runner's World Magazine, World Publications, P.O.B. 366, Mountain View, California 94040, USA. 112 pages, in English. 1975. Price: \$2.50.

Since Bikila, Keino, Kiprugut, Bayi and Aki-Bua, African sportsmen are being increasingly talked of and increasingly successful. This little book will perhaps help you to understand their secrets, their strengths and weaknesses, and enable you to perceive what these uncomplicated athletes have in store for us in the future.

ODPOWIEDZIALNOSE ZA SZKODY WYRZADZONE W ZWIAZKU Z UPRAWIANIEM SPORTU (Liability for damage caused in connection with the practice of sport), by Stanislaw Jedruch. Published by Wydawnictwo Prawnicze, Warsaw, Poland. 236 pages, in Polish. Résumé in German and French. 1972. Price: 35 zlotys.

The author examines here the bases of liability for damage caused during the practice of sport. After going over and defining what he means by sport and sports risk, he tackles the idea of "fault" which he considers to be essential and at the basis of the conception of liability. The work finishes by conclusions on the future of law in the field of sport.

BOAT RACING IN BRITAIN 1715-1975, by Keith Osborne. Published by the Amateur Rowing Association, 6 Lower Hall, Hammersmith, London W6 9DJ. 72 pages, in English. 1975.

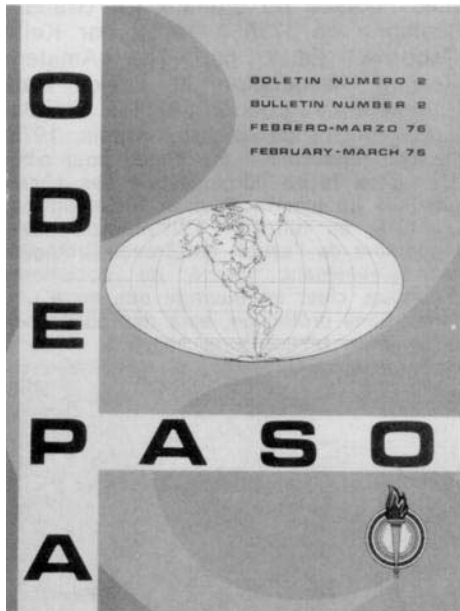
This booklet was produced to celebrate the holding of the world rowing championships at Nottingham in 1975 and retraces the history of the development of rowing in Britain. Beautifully illustrated with contemporary documents, this unpretentious work will be of great value in any sports library.



CHAMPIONS 1964-1974, edited by Heinz Heimann. Published by Georges Veuthey (Switzerland). With the collaboration of Mrs. Pamela MacGregor-Morris, Mrs. Sheila Willcox and Mr. François-Achille Roch. 1975, 218 pages, in French, English and German. Very many colour or black and white illustrations.

This passage from the foreword by the President of the Fédération Equestre Internationale, H.R.H. the Duke of Edinburgh, sums up this book perfectly: "...The end result of all this effort is the Champions. After all the training and preparation, after all the organisation, all the paper work and financial anxiety, after all the excitement of the competition and the enthusiasm of the crowds, a champion is created. This book is about the Champions, the heroes of the sport today, and I hope, the administrators of the sport in the future." A book which every horse lover will want to own.

THE ODEPA/PASO BULLETIN



The Pan-American Sports Organisation (ODEPA/PASO), under the presidency of Mr. Mario Vázquez Raña, President of the Mexican Olympic Committee, is to publish a glossy information bulletin six times per year. The No. 1 was devoted to the ODEPA's last Congress and to the new organisation that has been set up. The second edition, under the subject "friendship at the service of sport", announces the new President's plan of work.

SPORT 76. HANDBUCH DES SCHWEIZER SPORTES (Handbook of Swiss Sport), by Hugo Steinegger, press officer of the Swiss Physical Education Association. Published by Habegger Verlag, 4552 Derendingen, Switzerland. 260 pages, 130 illustrations, in German. 1975. Price: 9.80 SF.

With "Sport 73" began a long series of extremely valuable works of reference. This fourth edition, devoted above all to the 1976 Olympic Games at Innsbruck and Montreal, contains as usual a complete review of the history, addresses, records, results and future competitions of all sports practised in Switzerland.

LES GRANDES HEURES DE LA BOXE (Boxing's finest hours), by Guy Benamou and François Terbeen. Published by Pygmalion, 198, boulevard Saint-Germain, Paris. 250 pages, in French. 1975.

Sullivan, Corbett, Fitzsimmons, Dempsey, Carpentier, Joe Louis, Armstrong... do you know them? Probably, if you are a boxing enthusiast. In any case all these champions, and many others, of yesterday and today are still heroes whose career, adventures and fights have been well highlighted by the authors. Let us thank them and hope that their book helps its readers to discover the true aspect of the "noble art".
