

# Olympism in mourning




- **Alfredo Oscar Imenarrieta Inciarte is no more**

Elected IOC member for Uruguay in 1963, Alfredo Inciarte had sent his resignation to his colleagues, meeting last summer in Lausanne at the 76th IOC Session. No one imagined at that time that he had only several months to live.

Born in 1900 at Montevideo, a lawyer, Director and President of many companies, he considered and practised sport throughout his life as an enthusiastic amateur.

President of the National Yachting Club and of the National Rowing Federation, he was also Director of the Automobile Centre of Uruguay. The *Olympic Review* expresses its deep shock to his family, to sportsmen in Uruguay and to the deceased's many friends.



- **Patrick J. Carroll**, President of the Olympic Council of Ireland (OCI), died on 6th December last, aged 72. A former police commissioner, throughout his life he devoted himself to the development of Irish amateur sport and especially of boxing. Associated with the Olympic movement from 1946, he held the post of chef de mission at six successive Olympiad celebrations between 1952 and 1972. Treasurer of the OCI from 1947 to 1950, Secretary General from 1950 to 1973, he then acceded to the presidency, succeeding Lord Killanin who had become President of the IOC.

As Mr. Desmond O'Sullivan, Secretary General of the OCI, recalls: "*Patrick Carroll was a man of great quality and integrity and amateur sport and the Olympic movement are much the poorer by his passing.*"

The "*Olympic Review*" shares the sorrow of the deceased's family, his friends and Irish sportsmen.

- **René Maheu**, Director General of the UNESCO from 1962 to 1973, died at the end of 1975.
