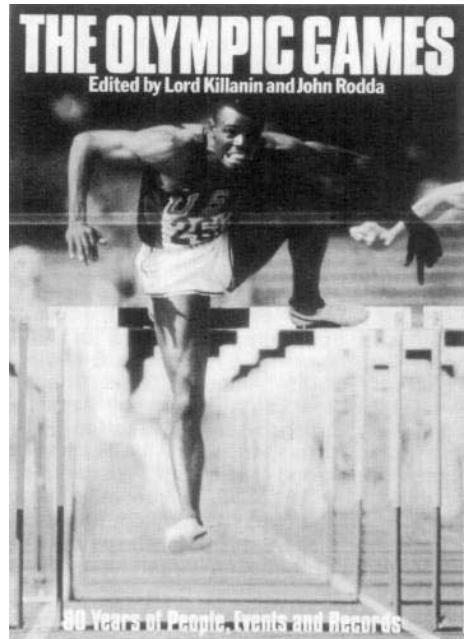

Inc., 866 Third Avenue, New York, N.Y. 10022, United States, and Barrie and Jenkins, London, Great Britain. 1976, 300 pages, 16 colour and 180 black and white illustrations, in English. Price: 17.95 dollars.

It has been talked about for a long time, we have been expecting it and now it has finally arrived. Book of prestige, of depth, a reference work, this volume constitutes the most complete history ever written on the modern Olympic Games. Lord Killanin cherished the idea for quite some time, and John Rodda has enabled him to realise it.

Readers of the "Olympic Review" are well acquainted with Mr. Conrado Durantez of

whom we speak often and who makes regular contributions to the enrichment of this review's contents.

Mr. Durantez, Director of the Centre of Olympic Studies of the INEF, honorary member of the International Olympic Academy, author of a previous work on "The Ancient Olympic Games", gives us in these two sumptuously illustrated volumes the most valuable amount of knowledge and information ever assembled on the sacred sanctuary of Olympia where the Games were born: sociology, history, archeology, sport, ethymology, chronology, bibliography, etc.

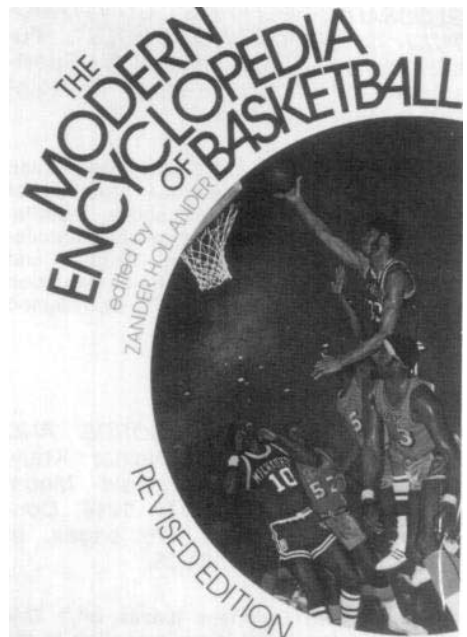
From now on, one will only have to refer to this absolutely indispensable work to evoke the ancient Games in their entirety.

*LE FOOTBALL*, by Paul Frantz. Published by the commercial department of the newspaper "L'Alsace", 2, avenue A. Briand, 68053 Mulhouse Cedex, France. 246 pages, in French. 1975. Price: 35 FF.

This book represents a complete approach to football and its surroundings. Intended both for football technicians, trainers and teachers as well as students, it is divided into two sections—theory and practice. Well illustrated with several photographs and diagrams, it will be of inestimable use to those who want to teach this sport.

*OLYMPIA RENKAAT 1974* (The Olympic Rings 1974). Published by the Finnish NOC. 115 pages, in Finnish, with resume in English. 1975.

This is a study of the Olympic ideal and Finland's Olympic history, both from the national and international point of view. None of the important problems facing present-day sport is overlooked, whether it be elite-ism, relations between the press and the athletes, doping, upheaval in international sport, leadership of international sport, etc.



*THE MODERN ENCYCLOPEDIA OF BASKETBALL*, by Zander Hollander. Published by Four Winds Press, 50 West 44th Street, New York, USA. 547 pages, in English. Reprint. Price: \$14.95.

Since Dr. Naismith created basketball in 1891 the game has conquered the whole world with astonishing speed. Solely devoted to the development of basketball in the United States, this surprisingly detailed book is the richest source to be found on the subject.

*SYMPOSIUM ON YOUTH AND CANOE SPORT*, published by the Federation Internationale de Canoë.

This is the report of the symposium held in Madrid in December 1973 by the Federación Española de Piraguismo on the problems of promoting canoeing among young people, training plans, medical controls, etc.

*GLOSSARY OF TERMS "CONSTRUCTION OF SWIMMING POOLS"*. Published by the IAKS, Institut für Sportstättenbau, Carl-Diem-Weg, 5 Köln-Müngersdorf, Germany.

Founded in 1965, the IAKS is an association which collects and publishes practical or theoretical information on sports installations. This small brochure is a trial dictionary of definitions in German, English and French of the terms used in the construction of swimming pools. A venture to be retained and increased.

*AMAZING SPORTS RECORDS AND OTHER ODDITIES*, by Nestor Kraly. Published by Fawcett Gold Medal Books, Greenwich, P.O.B. 1014, Connecticut 06830, USA. 176 pages, in English, 1975. Price: \$1.25.

"Begins where Guinness leaves off." This mention on the cover is an indication to the type of records contained in this book: the unusual, curious, baroque or in bad taste, or more simply what has never been seen or done.

*MONACO 1972, LA LUNGA NOTTE DEI FEDAIN* (Munich 1972, the Long Night of the Fedayin), by Domenico Carratelli. Published by Tublio Pironti, Naples, Italy. 154 pages, in Italian. 1972. Price: 1,400 lire.

Carratelli has tried—and succeeded—to give us a new vision of the brilliant and tragic Games of the XXth Olympiad as he saw and experienced them as an Italian journalist.

*SPORTS MEDICINE*, by S. K. Lee and K. H. Lim. Published by the NOC of Singapore, P.O.B. 2941, Singapore 1. In English. 1973.

A sports medicine seminar was held at Singapore on 30th and 31st August 1973 at the

same time as the 7th South-East Asian Peninsula Games. Messrs. Lee and Lim have selected certain lectures they felt to be of immediate interest to people concerned with sport in that part of the world.

*DIE "OLYMPISCHEN SPIELE" ROBERT DOVERS* (Robert Dover's "Olympic Games"), by Joachim K. Rühl. Published by Annales Universitatis Saraviensis No. 14, 6900 Heidelberg 1, Carl Winter Universitätsverlag. 262 pages, in German. 1975. Price: DM 58.

This is a very detailed and elaborate study on the athletic games organised from 1612 until 1852 on "Dover Hill" near Weston-Sub-Edge (England) by Captain Robert Dover.

*JUDO D'ATTAQUE* (Attacks in Judo) by Jean-Luc Masnières. Publishers: Amphora, 14, rue de l'Odéon, 75006 Paris. 1975, 160 pages, in French.

Devoted to the construction of attack in modern judo, this work is the follow-up to "Judo Sportif" (Sporting Judo) which has appeared in the same Collection. Illustrated by the author's photographs and diagrams, it analyses in succession direct attack from both static and moving positions, and then he discusses the combinations and conditioning which help to use the energy of the opponent.

*FERNSEHEN UND OLYMPISCHE SPIELE* (Television and Olympic Games), by M. Stinmann and F. Zölch. Published by the Abteilung Publikumsforschung der Schweizerischen Radio- und Fernsehgesellschaft (SRG), Berne. In German. 1975.

This is a statistical study of the viewing levels of the television broadcasts of the Munich Games on the three Swiss national networks (German, French and Italian language services). The conclusions of this enquiry are particularly interesting and are worthy of close study.

## *MEDICAL CONTROL AT THE OLYMPIC GAMES*

The IOC medical brochure, drawn up by the Medical Commission under the chairmanship of the Prince de Mérode, has just been completely remodelled in view of the Innsbruck and particularly Montreal Games. The International Olympic Committee hastily printed this brochure and sent it to all the members of the International Olympic Committee, the International Federations, the National Olympic Committees and the Organising Committees in the first half of December. A more elaborate version will be sent to them by the Montreal Organising Committee at the beginning of this year.

*The brochure contains:*

- an introduction by Lord Killanin, President of the IOC;
- list of members of the IOC Medical Commission;
- doping control;
- anabolic steroids and sport;
- list of doping substances;
- regulations: selection of athletes, sample-taking procedure, sample analysis, femininity tests.

NOCs are asked to make sure that the members of their delegation at the Olympic Games have carefully studied the contents of this brochure, published in French and English. It is obtainable from the International Olympic Committee, Château de Vidy, 1007 Lausanne, Switzerland, at the cost of 10 Swiss francs.

*LEXIKON DER 12,000 OLYMPIONIKEN* (Who's Who at the Olympics), by Erich Kamper. Published by Leykam Verlag, Stempfergasse 3, 8011 Graz, Austria. 672 pages, 104 illustrations, in German, 1975. Price: 720 Austrian schillings.

After his two works devoted to the Olympic Games (Encyclopaedia of the Winter Games—1964 and Encyclopaedia of the Olympic Games—1972), Erich Kamper gives us here the first real Who's Who at the Olympics with this concise biography of 12,000 Olympic medallists. An irreplaceable and invaluable volume.

*CENTRO DE ESTUDIOS OLIMPICOS - ACTAS 1968-1973, INEF MADRID* (Olympic Study Centre - 1968-1973 Report, INEF Madrid). Published by the Instituto Nacional de Educación Física, Madrid, Spain. 288 pages, in Spanish. 1975.

In 1968 the INEF created its first Olympic study course. Since then more and more students and renowned lecturers come each year to the INEF, welcomed by its dynamic director Mr. José M. Cagigal. This book contains all the lectures, speeches and interventions of the first five courses held, discreetly illustrated by a few remarkable documents and various photographs of these different sessions.
