EL MUNDO DE LOS DEPORTES (The world of sports), by Andrés Mercé Varela. Published by Martin Casanovas, Provenza 120, Barcelona 15 (ESP). 1976, 96 pages, in Spanish.

Presented by Lord Killanin, President of the IOC, and prefaced by Juan Antonio Samaranch, Vice-President of the IOC, this discovery of the world of sports is aimed at adolescents and gives them the essential basis of what they should know of the Olympic movement, the renovation of the Games and the major sports disciplines they contain. Beautifully illustrated by Pilarin Bayes, this book deserves to belong to every library for young readers.

GUIDE DE CARDIOLOGIE DU SPORT (Sports cardiology guide), by Prof. F. Plas. Published by Besins-Iscovesco Laboratories, 5, rue du Bourg l'Abbé, 75003 Paris (FRA), distributed by Edi-

tions J.-B. Baillière, 19, rue Hautefeuille, 75279 Paris Cédex 06 (FRA). 1976, 160 pages, in French.

The fruit of a long period of observation begun 30 years ago, this work should allow sports doctors to make use of the necessary knowledge of cardiac physiology to guide athletes and should also allow cardiologists (who are not all athletes) to become sufficiently acquainted with sport to advise people with heart trouble in the practice, which has finally been acknowledged useful, of controlled and correctly evaluated physical activities.

LA VOIE JACKSON (The Jackson Way), by Gérard Herzog. Published by Arthaud, 6, rue Mézière, 75006 Paris (FRA). 312 pages, in French.

Author, producer and script writer, Gérard Herzog—a mountaineer like his brother Maurice, member of the IOC—gives us here a novel of exceptional force and keenness to the glory of mountains and the men and women who try to dominate them.

FUNF RINGE - FUNF ZEICHNER (Five rings - five artists), by Rudolf Ferch, Salzburg (AUT).

This album contains the best drawings and caricatures that five European cartoonists—Behrendt (Amsterdam), Hanitzsch (Munich), Ironimus (Vienna), Murschetz (Munich) and Reisinger (Zagreb)—brought out during the XIth Winter Games at Innsbruck in 1976. It will enable everybody who attended the Games to relive them in another light.

LE BASKET (Basketball) by Georges Naccari and Michel Rouyère. Published by De Vecchi, 20 rue de la Trémoille, 75008 Paris (France). 1976, 152 pages, in French.

Basketball is a subtle, fast game which calls for great expertise and uncommon sports stamina. The authors' intention here has been to supply advice, indicate exercises, expose techniques and point out the essential rules, in order to train a "real" player or to make the reader a knowledgeable, and thus they hope loyal, spectator who is enamoured of fair play.

DE OLYMPISCHE SPELEN - MONTREAL - INNSBRUCK 1976 (The Olympic Games - Montreal - Innsbruck 1976) by Ed van Opzeeland. Published by Helmut Lingen, Cologne (GER). 1976, 319 pages, in Dutch.

Among all the books that have been published on the Montreal and Innsbruck Games, this one deserves a special mention on account of its really exceptional colour photographs which do not leave any sport aside and wonderfully illustrate the many aspects of the Montreal competitions.

SPORT IN ISRAEL 1976. Published by the Olympic Committee of Israel. 1976, in English and Hebrew.

This book, published by the NOC, contains simply many excellent colour and black and white photographs on Olympic or other sports practised in Israel. A short introduction by Emmanuel Gill describes the country's sports organisation and enables the reader to understand this country's sporting life better.

L'ÉQUIPE DE SUISSE (The Swiss Team), by Guy Balibouse and Pierre Tripod. Published by Sporama, Lausanne (SUI); distributed by Payot Bookshop, rue de Bourg 1, 1000 Lausanne (SUI). 1976, 216 pages, in French.



This is the first book devoted to the history of the Swiss football team since its first official match on 12th February 1905. Since then, success and failure, fame and setback have succeeded one another. Guy Balibouse and Pierre Tripod have combined their long years

of experience as sports journalists and their knowledge of Swiss football to produce this souvenir book for all football fans and supporters of the Swiss team.

ENCYCLOPÉDIE DES SPORTS (Encyclopaedia of sports). Published by Elsevier Sequoia, 1, rue du 29-Juillet, 75001 Paris (FRA) and avenue Louise 142, bte 8, 1050 Brussels (BEL). 1976, 320 pages, in French.



This is the French version of the remarkable book by the Diagram Group entitled "Rules of the Games" which we presented in No. 87-88 of the "Olympic Review".

It has been translated by Jean Noël and supervised by our friend Jean Cornhumel of the Brussels "Les Sports".

AFRICA AT THE OLYMPICS, by Ramadhan Ali. Published by Africa Books, Kirkman House, 54A Tottenham Court Road, London W1 (GBR). 1976, 162 pages, 40 illustrations, in English.

Here is the point of view of the Africans, in particular the Black Africans, on sport in general and the Olympic Games. Ramadhan Ali, a journalist, attempts to prove that the intrusion of politics in sport is not the Africans' doing and that the IOC has often been in the wrong.

SPORT 77 (Handbook of Swiss sport), by Hugo Steinegger. Published by the Association Nationale d'Education Physique (ANEP). Printed by Habegger, 4552 Derendingen (SUI). 1976, 264 pages, 160 illustrations, in German. Price: S. Fr. 9.80.

This is the fifth time that this guide of sporting life in Switzerland has appeared. Edited and brought up to date by Hugo Steinegger, head of ANEP's press department in Berne, "Sport 77" gives the major facts concerning 70 sports practised in Switzerland, their calendar, their records, important addresses, etc. It is enriched this year by the biographical presentation of Switzerland's top athletes.
