

## The Tripartite Commission in Lausanne

The elected representatives of the International Olympic Committee, the International Federations and the National Olympic Committees (Tripartite Commission) met in Lausanne on 17th and 18th February under the chairmanship of Lord Killanin, President of the IOC, to review the future of sport throughout the world and the actions that can be envisaged in this respect in the forthcoming months.

The Tripartite Commission which was first created in 1970 to organise the Varna Congress in 1973 became a permanent body after that Congress.

Krumm (President, United States Olympic Committee). — *For the 1981 Olympic Congress:* Mr. Willi Daume.

The Tripartite Commission also heard a report from Mr. Willi Daume on the organisation of the next Olympic Congress which will be held in Baden-Baden or Hamburg in 1981.
