

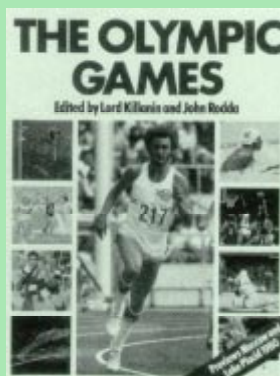
## Bibliography

**THE OLYMPIC GAMES**, by Lord Killanin and John Rodda. Published by Macdonald and Jane's, Paulton House, Shepherdess Walk, London N 1 7 LW. 320 pages. In English. Price : 23.60 SF.

When its first edition appeared in 1976, "The Olympic Games" met with great success for its authors. The President of the International Olympic Committee, Lord Killanin, and John Rodda, a British journalist on the staff of the "Guardian", who has faithfully attended all Olympic celebrations since 1960.

With only a few months remaining before the Winter Games in Lake Placid and the Summer Games in Moscow, Lord Killanin and John Rodda have taken up their

work once again. The President of the IOC has updated the 1976 edition of "The Olympic Games" with



the addition of chapters devoted to the forthcoming Olympic encounters and the evolution of Olympism.

John Rodda's contribution focuses on the 1976 Games in Montreal while John Samuel retraces the staging of the XIth Winter Games in Innsbruck.

The volume features thorough, documented, well-written articles accompanied by exhaustive biographies dealing with more than 200 important figures in the realm of Olympism past and present—a veritable "Who's Who" of the history of the Games. Also included are complete tables of Olympic medal winners and results along with many, many illustrations, both novel and moving, often beautiful, and occasionally distressing.

"The Olympic Games" is, beyond all doubt, one of the great reference works on the history of the Games.

**OLYMPIAD - 80 : HEARTY WELCOME.** Published by Novosti, Moscow 1979.



The Novosti Press Agency publishing house recently issued a very concise, yet complete booklet entitled "Olympiad-80 : Hearty Welcome" intended to familiarise the prospective Olympic visitor with virtually all aspects of the host city for the Games of the XXII<sup>nd</sup> Olympiad. The reader is provided with an endless stream of useful information outlining not only current preparations for the Olympic competitions, but also the history of Moscow, the national physical education programme and even a whirlwind tour of the USSR's four other Olympic cities, Leningrad, Kiev, Minsk and Tallinn.

**BADMINTON, SPORT TOTAL** (Badminton. The Complete Sport), by Roger van Meerbeek. Published by ADEPS, 4-27 Galerie Ravenstein, 1000 Brussels, 1979. 258 pages, in French. Price : 8.25 SF.

This book offers at the same time an explanation for the uninitiated, instruction for the average player, a means of self-testing for the practised competitor and a guide

for the instructor or teacher. Roger van Meerbeek, Belgian champion on 16 occasions, contributes all his knowledge and talent to the work.

**PSYCHO - CYBERNETIQUE** (Psycho-cybernetics), by Dr. Maxwell Maltz. Published by Christian H. Godefroy, F 27760 La Ferrière, 1979. 216 pages, in French.

It is well known that many athletes, capable of recording high-level performances while training on their own, meet with dismal failures in the competition stadium. This breakdown is often the result of psychosomatic blockage which "psycho-cybernetics" endeavours to eliminate by means of a highly practical method.

**METODOLOGIA DO TREINO DESPORTIVO** (Methodology of Sports Training), by a symposium of Portuguese coaches. Published by ISEF, Lisbon. 1979. 391 pages, in Portuguese.

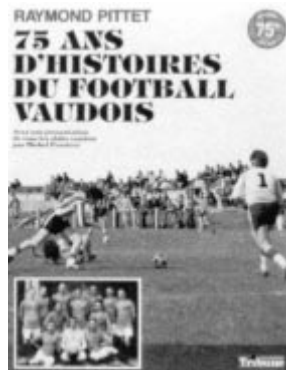
The history and development of sport, techniques, psychology, medical problems and equipment are the major topics dealt with in this report.

**LA CONSULTATION MÉDICALE DU CYCLISTE** (Medical Advice for the Cyclist). by Dr. J. P. de Mondenard. Published by Amphora, 14, rue de l'Odéon, 75006 Paris, 1979. 230 pages, in French.

Dr. de Mondenard has assembled in this work a good deal of standard advice related to greatly varied areas

ranging from medical aptitude tests to doping. Discussion also centres on the bicycle as a "therapeutic agent", heart troubles, over-training, poor adaptation to equipment and dietary problems.

**75 ANS D'HISTOIRES DU FOOTBALL VAUDOIS** (75 Years of Vaudois Football Stories), by Raymond Pittet, assisted by Michel Perrière. Published by Tribune - Le Matin, 33, avenue de la Gare, Lausanne, 1979. 131 pages, in French.



Raymond Pittet, a highly-regarded journalist in the world of football and a regular contributor to numerous publications, has already earned acclaim by virtue of several fine books dealing with football, a sport to which he is profoundly attached. On this occasion he turns his attention to the clubs located in his region, the Canton Of Vaud in Switzerland, and relates a thousand anecdotes involving the activities of these unpretentious teams. Seventy-five years of stories ... rather than 75 years of history !
