

Association of European National Olympic Committees (ENOCs)

Generously invited by the Monaco Olympic Committee (COM), 26 European secretaries general, or their deputies, met in the Principality for their second seminar on 30th and 31st October 1979.

As Mr. Henri Rey, President of the COM, pointed out, the purpose of the two-day gathering was to strengthen the ties of friendship between those dedicated to furthering the progress of the Olympic movement.

Ties of friendship, of course, but also work within the framework of a very full agenda which comprised the following main points :

the Olympic movement, an important factor in the fight for peace and understanding between nations ; sport and fair play ; financing the Olympic movement; the marketing and commercialisation of sport, etc. Those taking part also had an opportunity to hear a report on a proposed festival of sport and on the forthcoming Olympic Congress at Baden-Baden in 1981.

Although no decisions were adopted, in accordance with the statutes, the wish was nevertheless expressed that seminars of this kind should be organised from time to time. Taking advantage of this friendly meeting, the Association's Executive Board held a work session, on 29th October, a summary of which will shortly be sent to all NOCs concerned.

International University Sports Federation (FISU)

● Fifty-two countries attended the *General Meeting of the FISU* in Mexico City on 30th and 31st August. In the course of the two-day several important decisions were taken :

- The university federations of Libya and Egypt were admitted as new members while Peru was granted provisional membership.
- The Executive Board will consist of 19 members (instead of 17) and is to be elected for a four-year period (previously two years).
- Federations organising future events : Spain (1981 Winter Universiad), Bulgaria (1983 Winter Universiad), Northern Ireland (1980 university cross-country WC¹, 29th March), Great Britain (1981 university table tennis WC¹), Middlesborough (8th-14th September), Switzerland (1980 orienteering WC¹, St. Gall 14th-19th July), Poland (1980 Judo WC¹, Warsaw, 24th-29th September).
- The proposal to reintroduce national anthems during the opening and closing ceremonies of the World University Games was not approved.
