THE XIIIth WINTER OLYMPIC GAMES LAKE PLACID 1980. Editorial Director James Kuse. Published by Ideals Publishing Company, Milwaukee, Wisconsin (USA) 1979. 79 pages, in English.

LAKE PLACID 1980 THE COMPLETE HANDBOOK OF THE OLYMPIC WINTER GAMES. Edited by Zander Hollander. Published by Signet, New York, New York (USA). 224 pages, in English. Price : \$US 2.75.

These volumes feature complete descriptions of all the sports on the programme, helpful historical background, results, outstanding competitors past and present, plus an array of splendid photographs.

SCHWIMMEN IN VERGANGENHEIT UND GEGENWART (Swimming past and present) by Klaus M. Fiedler with the collaboration of Dr. Klaus Liebold. Published by Sportverlag, Berlin (GDR) 1979. Two volumes, 216 pages each, in German.

The chronicles of German swimming are documented in this thorough and well-illustrated work, volume one dealing with activities in Germany prior to 1945 and volume two with the German Democratic Republic in the post-war era. Period photographs and drawings will fascinate and amuse history enthusiasts, while a section devoted to statistics and records bears testimony of the success which has always been achieved by German athletes in this sport.

URHEILUN VUOSIKIRJA 1978-79 (Finnish Sports Yearbook 1978-79), by Markku Siukonen and Matti Ahola. Published by Scandina Kirjat, Jyväskylä (FIN) 1979. 272 pages, in Finnish.



A thorough survey of Finnish sport literally from A to Z in encyclopedia form. Also included are special reports, background and statistics on the forthcoming Olympic competitions and other international events.

THE OFFICIAL 1980 OLYMPIC GUIDE, by John V. Grombach. Published by Times Books (USA), 1980. 352 pages, in English. Price: \$US 5.95.

With a chapter devoted to each individual sport and a special section dealing with team sports, this handbook offers a particularly thorough examination of Olympic sports, both summer and winter. Those interested in history are provided with descriptions of past Olympic events as well as a complete list of gold medalists.

The complete story of the organisation of the XIIIth Winter Games is retold here in vivid detail.

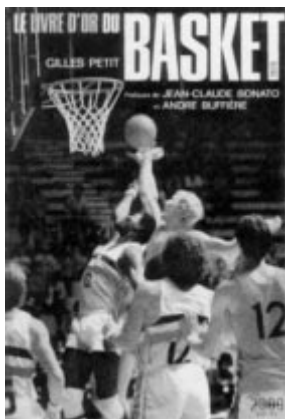
COACH, ATHLETE AND SPORT PSYCHOLOGIST by Peter Klavara and Juri V. Daniel. Published by the University of Toronto School of Physical and Health Education (CAN). 315 pages, in English. 1979.

Five prominent sports psychologists from different countries have contributed to this work, thus sharing their considerable experience. A great variety of related topics are covered, including studies on athletes' behaviour and performance, and also on the growing need for sports psychology in sport practice. The information this book contains is not only invaluable to all athletes and coaches, but is also of interest to the lay reader.

BRUCE JENNER'S GUIDE TO THE OLYMPICS, by Bruce Jenner and Mark Abraham. Published by Andrews and McMeel Inc., New York, New York (USA), 1979. 327 pages, in English. Price : \$US 6.95.

Gold medallist in the decathlon at Montreal, Bruce Jenner, together with freelance journalist Mark Abraham, offers a glimpse at both events and facilities at this summer's Olympic Games.

This series offers relaxed commentary on the year's sports activities in France, together with interviews and a wide variety of photographs, always interesting, often revealing.

Complete results of each event and an account of the fortunes of individual performers complete the two works.
