With great sorrow, we have learned of the recent deaths of the following defenders of the Olympic and sports movement.

- **Francis Holmes** (USA, 95), participant in the athletic events at the 1908 Olympic Games in London (high jump and triple jump).
- **Mario Lanzi** (ITA, 66), second in the 800-metre event at the 1936 Olympic Games.
- **Colonel Mario Mylius** (SUI, 68), 8th place competitor in the three-day event in 1936, following which he served as a judge and official for equestrian events.

- **Alfred Plé** (FRA, 93), member of the 3rd place double sculls team at the 1920 Olympic Games.
- **Couto E. Santos** (POR, 56) assistant director of the "Mundo Desportivo" editorial board.
- **Colonel Hernan Vigil-Simpson** (CHI, 68), Olympic equestrian competitor (1952), FEI judge and President of Chilean federation of equestrian sports.
- **Paul Wilwertz**, who formerly served as President of the Luxembourg Olympic and Sports Committee and Vice-President of the Union Cycliste Internationale.
- **Frank C. Wykoff** (USA, 70), a member of the gold medal-winning teams in the 4 x 100 m. relay event on three occasions—1928, 1932 and 1936.
