Television contract signed

On 19th June 1980, the International Olympic Committee and the Sarajevo Organising Committee signed a contract with the American Broadcasting Corporation awarding that company the exclusive rights for television broadcasting in the United States of the XIVth Winter Games in Sarajevo. The rights were awarded for the sum of 91.5 million dollars.

The negotiations between the three partners concerned took place at IOC headquarters.

A total of 25 million dollars will revert to the IOC which, in accordance with tradition, will share this sum with the International Federations and the National Olympic Committees.

Composition of OCOG announced

The Sarajevo OCOG has now been officially constituted in its final form. Composed of 67 members, including representatives from all the republics making up Yugoslavia, this Committee is presided over by Mr. Branko Mikulic.

The OCOG's structure provides for five Vice-Presidents, one of these positions being filled by Mr. Anton Sucic, President of the Town Assembly of Sarajevo. The duties of Secretary General will be performed by Mr. Ahmed Karabegovic.

An Executive Board made up of 22 members including Mr. Boris Bakrac, IOC member in Yugoslavia, and Mr. Djordje Peklic, President of the Yugoslav Olympic Committee, was also elected.
