

IOC meetings

The month of January saw four important meetings of IOC Commissions. A meeting of the Finance Commission was convened in Paris (FRA) on 15th January and the Tripartite Commission held meetings in Baden-Baden (FRG) from 22nd to 24th January (see opposite). These were followed by meetings of the Commission for Olympic Solidarity (26th) and the Eligibility Commission (29th) in Lausanne (SUI).

The Tripartite Commission



23rd January 1981 saw a meeting in Baden-Baden of the IOC's Tripartite Commission, chaired by Mr. Juan Antonio Samaranch, President of the International Olympic Committee. All members were present, except H.E. Mr. Louis Guirandou N'Diaye, who was unable to attend due to official duties.

The new chief of IOC protocol, Mr. Kees Kerdel, was also present at the meeting.

On 22nd January, a meeting of the working group chaired by Mr. Vitaly Smirnov, first vice-president of the IOC, had made it possible to prepare for adoption by the full commission several documents which are very important for the preparation and progress of the XIth Olympic Congress, including the final programme and regulations of the Congress, which we publish on the following pages.

In addition, many decisions were taken regarding the guests and observers to be invited to the congress, the accreditation of press representatives and their attendance at the debates etc...

All members of the commission were particularly grateful to Mr. Willi Daume, President of the Organising committee of the Congress for the excellent preparations for the meetings and the comprehensive report he presented to the Commission.

Finally, it was decided that the next meeting of the Tripartite Commission should be held in Brussels on 3rd June. The working group of the Tripartite Commission will meet in Moscow on 15th and 16th March and then in Brussels on 2nd June.
