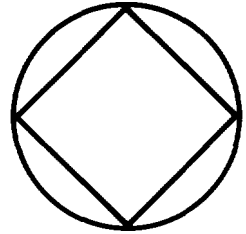




# XIth Olympic Congress Baden-Baden, 1981



## Regulations

In accordance with Rule 17C of the "Olympic Charter", the President of the International Olympic Committee has convened the XIth Olympic Congress which is to take place in Baden-Baden (Federal Republic of Germany), from 23rd to 28th September 1981.

The IOC President will take the chair and settle all matters of procedure.

It is recalled that no vote may be taken by the Congress, but recommendations only may be made on the final day, which will be submitted to the IOC for study and action.

### 1. COMPOSITION

#### The Congress is composed of:

- Members and Honorary Members of the International Olympic Committee.
- Delegates of the International Sports Federations whose sport is on the Olympic programme (Maximum of three per federation).
- Delegates of the National Olympic Committees (Maximum three per NOC).

NB: Members of the Tripartite Commission are not counted in the delegations of their respective organisation.

All delegates mentioned above may deliver a speech or take part in the debates.

#### Guests to be invited to speak

The Secretary General of the United Nations.  
The Director General of UNESCO.

Athletes (4) among the 30 invited as observers.

One coach among the 10 invited as observers.

**Observers** (not allowed to deliver a speech or take part in the debates).

Members of the IOC Commissions not attending in any other capacity.

Recognised Olympic Federations (9 Federations : maximum 2 per Federation).

Non-recognised Sports Federations affiliated to GAISF (11 Federations: one per Federation).

Guests of the President of the IOC (5).

Guests of the President of the Organising Committee (5).

Recipients of the Silver medal in the Olympic Order (not attending in any other capacity).

Athletes (30) (Including 4 to be elected to speak).

Coaches (10) (Including one to be elected to speak).

Representatives from the OCOGs (Maximum 6 per OCOG) of the following Games :

- Moscow;
- Lake Placid ;
- Los Angeles ;
- Sarajevo.

Candidate cities for the 1988 Games : Athens, Melbourne, Nagoya, Seoul, (Games of

the Olympiad) and Calgary, Cortina d'Ampezzo and Falun (Winter Games). (6 per candidate committee).

Organisations and various personalities chosen by the Tripartite Commission. (One person per organisation).

## 2. ACCREDITATION

Representatives from the IFs and NOCs will only be admitted to participate in the Congress on the authority of a delegation signed on the headed paper of their respective organisation, by the President and/or Secretary General of the Organisation they represent.

IOC members may not be accredited, or speak, in any other capacity (IF, NOC or Press).

No double accreditations will be allowed. (es. member of an IF and NOC or journalist).

**International Federations** (Maximum three per Federation).

The International Sports Federations will nominate their delegates, who must be a member of their Board (Executive Committee, Inner Committee, Administrative Committee or the Executive).

**National Olympic Committees** (Maximum three per NOC)

The NOC delegate whose expenses are met by Olympic Solidarity must be the President, Vice-President or Secretary General of the NOC, and must sign the Roll Call every day.

The two other delegates must :

- a) Be resident in and hold the nationality of the country they represent ;
- b) Be members of the NOC's Board (Executive Board, Inner Committee, Administrative Committee, or the Executive).

Only one of the two remaining representatives from an NOC may be replaced by a member of the country's most representative sports governing body.

Guests of the delegates : See "Instructions for IOC meetings". They will not be allowed to attend the debates.

The delegations will be verified by a special commission formed by the Tripartite Commission for the Olympic Congress, and whose representatives are specially nominated for this by the three constituent organisations of the Tripartite Commission.

No delegate may be nominated after 14th July 1981.

The number of delegates, when submitted, will be final. Any changes after this date must be submitted to the secretariat of the group concerned.

In case of dispute, the final decision of the IOC will be binding.

### Press

Representatives of the five international agencies, AFP, AP, Reuters, Tass, UPI, will be accredited directly by the IOC.

Invitations to sports journalists will be passed through and placed under the responsibility of their respective NOCs.

The accreditation process for the press will be dealt with exclusively by the IOC.

### Identification

Accreditation for IOC members will be carried out directly by the IOC.

Accreditation badges must be worn by all participants at all times.

## 3. AGENDA

The agenda has been prepared by the IOC after consultation with the IFs and the NOCs. The following themes were adopted by the Tripartite Commission :

1. The Future of the Olympic Games.
2. International co-operation.
3. The Olympic movement in prospective.

## 4. MOTTO

The motto of the XIth Congress is: "United by and for Sport".

## 5. INTERVENTIONS

The President of the International Olympic Committee, assisted by the Tripartite Commission, will preside over the Congress.





The programme for the speeches at the Congress will be drawn up by the Tripartite Commission.

The main final speeches (3 for each group - 45 minutes maximum), should reach the IOC no later than 30th June 1981 in either English or French.

The basic outlines of secondary speeches (10 minutes maximum), should be submitted to the IOC by each group in French or English, no later than 30th June 1981.

Free interventions (5 minutes maximum) should be submitted to the secretariat of the Congress 48 hours in advance in French or English, if their authors wish these to be translated and printed.

## 6. SECRETARIAT

The Congress Secretariat will be run by the Director of the IOC-the Secretary General of the Congress-and her staff.

The IFs and NOCs may maintain a secretariat. Each secretariat is permitted a maximum of 4 persons, including one typist.

Each group will appoint liaison officers who will be responsible for maintaining links with the Congress Secretariat and the Organising Committee.

The Organising Committee Secretariat is placed under the responsibility of the Organising Committee and deals only with technical problems.

## 7. TRANSLATION AND INTERPRETATION

The official languages of the Congress are the official languages of the IOC - French and English.

The working languages of the Congress will be: French, English, Spanish, Russian and German.

The alphabetical order to be followed for all communications and publications will be that of the Olympic Directory.

## 8. PRACTICAL SETTLEMENT

All material and protocol problems will be settled in accordance with the "Instructions for the International Olympic Committee's Sessions".

## 9. REPORT

A report will be printed and distributed exclusively by the IOC in its two official languages. The official proceedings of the Congress will be constituted by this printed report, containing the complete speeches and interventions during the four days.

Any dispute concerning this report will be settled by the Tripartite Commission.

## 10. PRESS BRIEFINGS

A press briefing will be held on each day of the Congress. A representative of each group will be nominated to be responsible for this.

## 11. OFFICIAL PUBLICATIONS

Only those publications issued with the approval of the Tripartite Commission to be allowed.

No other publications (circulars, bulletins, reports, etc.) will be permitted to be distributed on the Congress premises.

## 12. RESPONSIBILITIES

All actions taken by the Organising Committee for the Congress, including those concerned with the social programme and in particular with regard to the dissemination of information to the media, may not be carried out without the prior approval of the IOC and the Secretary General of the Congress.



*Neither the IOC, nor the Tripartite Commission may be held responsible for expenses incurred by accredited participants at the Congress.*

*All questions not covered by these regulations will be resolved by the Tripartite Commission, after agreement by the President of the IOC.*
