LOS ANGELES 200, a bi-centennial celebration, by Art Seidenbaum and John Malmin with a foreword by Will Durant. Published by Harry N. Abrams, Inc., 110 East 59th Street, New York, N. Y. 10022, 1980. 320 pages, in English

Two centuries of history and 200 striking colour photographs of contemporary Los Angeles are linked together in a spectacular volume celebrating the bicentennial of the city that is to host the Games of the XXIIIrd Olympiad in 1984. In this handsome and original treatment, each photograph is accompanied by a lively commentary describing a key historical event in the city's development for every year since 1781.

OLIMPISKAYA ENTSIKLOPEDIA (Olympic Encyclopedia), edited by S. P. Pavlov. Published by 'Sport Encyclopedia', Moscow (URS), 1980, 415 pages, in Russian.

From A to Z, this practical reference book offers concise explanations on every aspect of the Olympic movement. IOC members, Federations, NOCs, Olympic champions, complete results - all the vital information is available to the reader at a quick glance. Colour photographs of Olympic stamps, posters and pins make the work particularly interesting.



100 ANS DE LA FÉDÉRATION INTERNATIONALE DE GYMNASTIQUE 1881-1981 (one hundred years of the International Gymnastics Federation) by Andre Huguenin. Published by the FIG, Juraweg 12, 3250 Lyss (SUI), 1981. 162 pages, in French.

This official history of the FIG traces one hundred years of the history of gymnastics and its governing body and constitutes a veritable encyclopaedia covering all aspects of the sport.

SPIELE DER XXII OLYMPIADE, MOSKAU 1980 (The Games of the XXIInd Olympiad, Moscow 1980). Published by the Society for the Furthering of the Olympic Ideal in the German Democratic Republic, Sportverlag, Berlin (GDR), 1980. 301 pages, in German

A handsomely illustrated souvenir of the celebration of the Games of the XXIInd Olympiad in Moscow featuring all the splendid ceremonial and the sports personalities that contributed to the overwhelming success of the occasion. A comprehensive results section completes the work.

OLYMPIABOKEN 1980 (the 1980 Olympic book). Published by Brunnhages Forlag, Upplandsgatan 22, 113 60 Stockholm (SWE), 1980. 336 pages, in Swedish

A companion volume to the popular Swedish sports encyclopaedia 'Idrottsboken' (reviewed in Olympic Review No. 155) devoted entirely to the XIIIth Winter Games in Lake Placid and the Games of the XXIInd Olympiad in Moscow. The work was prepared in consultation with the Swedish Olympic Committee.

SWIMMING TEACHING THEORY AND PRACTICE by Geoffrey Corlett. Published by Kaye and Ward Ltd, 21, New Street, London EC2M 4NT, 1980. 282 pages, in English.

This book by an expert coach deals with every aspect of the teaching of swimming. The four main strokes are tackled in depth and lesser known strokes are also mentioned. Also included are chapters on life-saving, survival and, by two experts in these subjects, water polo and synchronised swimming. In short, the book constitutes a complete swimming manual which will be of enormous value to coaches.



75 DANMARKS OLYMPISKE KOMITE, 1905-1980 (75 years, the Danish Olympic Committee, 1905-1980), edited by Gunnar Hansen and Elo Tostenaes. Published by the Danish Olympic Committee, Hus, Brøndbyvester pr, 2600 Glostrup (DEN), 1980. 64 pages, in Danish.



A special souvenir brochure commemorating the 75th anniversary of the Danish Olympic Committee. All the history and fine Olympic tradition of the committee is vividly recalled with reference to each celebration of the modern Games.

THE GUINNESS BOOK OF RECORDS - EDITION 27 edited and compiled by Norris McWhirter (sports editor Stan Greenberg). Published by Guinness superlatives Ltd., 2, Cecil Court, London Road, Enfield, Middlesex (GBR), 1980. 349 pages, available in 23 languages.

The 1981 edition of this perennial reference work has been completely revised and re-illustrated. The book closes with a 100 page section devoted entirely to sports, games and pastimes. Included is a table of current Olympic records (incorporating records set during the Games of the XXIInd Olympiad in Moscow) plus a host of statistics on the Olympic Games.

MOYENS AUDIOVISUELS DANS LE SPORT (Audiovisual methods applied to sport) by Guido Schilling and Walter Baur. Published by Birkhäuser Verlag, Basle (SUI), 1980. 424 pages.

This work represents the fruit of the labours of the 160 delegates, from 29 countries, who gathered at the Federal sports school at Magglingen (SUI) in September 1978 for a congress of the International Association of Higher Physical Education Schools (ALESEP). The congress dealt extensively with the theory and evolution of audio visual methods with particular reference to their use and application as coaching aids. The work closes with a section devoted to the research work on the subject currently being undertaken in various parts of the world.

ANÁLISE MACÂNICA DAS TÉCNICAS DE PROJECCÃO DO GÓKIO (Mechanical analysis of the techniques of Gokyo projection) by Fernando Almada.

FUNDAMENTOS E TÉCNICAS DE AVALIAÇÃO FÍSICA (Bases and techniques of evaluation in physical education) by Francisco Sobral and M. Luisa Melo Barrios.

Both works published by ISEF - Centro de Documentação e Informação, 1449 Lisbon, Codex (POR), 1980. 118 and 158 pages respectively, in Portuguese.

Two highly advanced manuals devoted to judo. The first work makes use of a particularly innovative presentation in order to present judo techniques visually while the second is devoted to a purely theoretical ap-

praisal of all aspects of the sport, with reference to the practice of evaluation in physical education using morphological and physiological methods.

FACULTATIS EDUCATIONIS PHYSICAE UNIVERSITATIS COMENIANE (Publications of the Physical Education Faculty of the University of Comenianus) Series XX and XXI. Articles published in Slovak with resumes in Russian and English. Published by Slovenske Pedagogicke Nakladateľstvo, Bratislava (ITCH).

These publications present articles dealing with recent developments in physical education throughout the world, but most particularly in Czechoslovakia and other eastern European countries. Topics dealt with in these two issues include sport psychology, volleyball and ice hockey techniques, training methods for hurdle races and new techniques used in Czechoslovak secondary schools in preparation for sports competitions.

Ó PÓLÓ...! by Pal Peterdi. Published by Sylvester Janos Nyomda, Kiskar u. 6, Szombathely (HUN), 1980. 230 pages, in Hungarian.

In his work, Pal Peterdi, a journalist and humourist of renown, outlines the development of water polo and traces the careers of a selection of its finest exponents, notably attacking players.
