• *The Xth Ordinary Congress of the AIBA* held in Colorado Springs (USA) on 22nd and 23rd November 1982. During this meeting, in which 240 delegates from 84 countries took part, Colonel Don Hull was re-elected as President of the Federation by proclamation.

• Canada will stage the next In-Line World Championships in July 1986 on the Olympic course in Montreal which offers excellent facilities.

Fédération Internationale Amateur de Cyclisme (FIAC)



• *The 151st Congress of the UCI* (Union Cycliste Internationale), held in Madrid (ESP) on 26th November 1982, drew up a list of "open" races. In this way, amateur cyclists will be able to compete against professionals in twenty-seven races in 1983.

- *Galina Tsareva* (URS) covered 5 km on an indoor track in '6'42"273 at the Olympic velodrome in Moscow (URS) on 3rd November 1982

Federation Equestre Internationale (FEI)



- *Making dressage more popular*

A debate on dressage was held in Lausanne (SUI) on 27th August 1982 on the occasion of the Vth Dressage World Championships. Mr. Fritz O. Widmer, Secretary General of the FEI, together with members of the Organising Committee, judges, competitors, coaches, and journalists - one hundred and twenty-live people in all - put forward several solutions for making dressage events more popular. The various suggestions - introduction of new figures, shorter and more interesting series of movements, more colour and faster results - will be examined by the FEI's Dressage Commission.

Federation Internationale d'Esclime (FIE - Fencing)



- *Safety first*

At its last meeting in Milan (ITA), the Commission for Signalling and Equipment decided to organise a competition with a view to studying any proposals likely to improve the protection of fencers. This Commission is working hard to submit to the FIE Congress in May 1983 the most concrete solutions, such as for example the possibility of ensuring that in the event of a heavy blow the blade will break at the hand-guard, or the wearing of a mask made of lexan somewhat similar to those worn by motorcyclists.

Fédération Internationale de Football Association (FIFA)

FIFA

- Composition of the four European groups established by FIFA with a view to the preliminary rounds of the Olympic Tournament in Los Angeles in 1984.

Group A : URS, HUN, BUL, TUR, GRE.

Group B: GDR, POL, FIN, NOR, DEN.

Group C: YUG, ROM, ITA, AUT, HOL, LIE.

Group D : ESP, FRA, POR, BEL, FRG, ISR.

The teams of HOL and LIE (group C) and those of FRG and ISR (group D) will play preliminary home and away matches. The winner in each case will be included in its respective group.

The winners of each group and the holder of the European title (Czechoslovakia) will represent Europe in the Games of the XXIIIrd Olympiad in Los Angeles.

Federation Internationale de Gymnastique (FIG)



- *Change of dates*

The first edition of the Rhythmic Gymnastics World Cup will be held in Belgrade (YUG) from 15th to 30th March 1983. It should have been held from 19th to 21st November 1982. The change was decided on 10th November 1982 by the organising committee together with representatives of the FIG.

International Judo Federation (IJF)



- *Kano Cup 1982*

Professor Yukimitsu Kano, President of the Japanese Judo Federation and the Kodokan, explains in the review published by the International Judo Federation, on the occasion of the Centenary of the foundation of the Kodokan and modern judo by Professor Jigoro Kano, the goal aimed at by this great master. "Pupils should master through hard training the principle of the

most effective use of the body and mind. Those adhering to this principle should be able to make a valuable contribution to the well-being of society and even perhaps, to the peaceful co-existence of mankind as a whole. Tournaments, in which force of character and physical strength were combined with technical perfection in the pursuit of victory, were considered a means of achieving this principle."

The best judokas in the world were invited to compete in the Kano cup 1982, organised by the Japanese Judo Federation and by the Kodokan. 220 competitors from 35 countries met therefore in Tokyo (JPN) from 11th to 14th November 1982.

- The Biathlon World Championships (Seniors and Juniors) will be held in the valley of Anterselva (ITA) from 20th to 27th February 1983. The 14th World Championships in 1975 were also held in this "cross-country" skiers paradise" situated in the heart of the magnificent Dolomites.

International Skating Union (ISU)



- *The Xlth World Speed Skating Championships*, women's and men's, will take place on 26th and 27th February 1983 in the "Oulunkyla" ice stadium 8 km from Helsinki (FIN).

Federation Internationale de Ski (FIS)



- In the editorial of the FIS's Official Bulletin of November 1982, Mr. *Marc Hodler*, President of the FIS and IOC member for Switzerland, recalled that : *"For many years our federation has been front-runner on matters of eligibility, setting forth very realistic and liberal rules."* For this reason the Federation's Eligibility Committee has decided not to propose any major amendments to the current regulations, *"Further openings are neither necessary nor desirable. They open the door to professionalism and endanger the position of our national ski federations and their control over the national teams"*, The only change proposed is the deletion of Rule 212.3 (reproduced below) which deals with advertising. Moreover, Mr. Marc Hodler concludes his editorial by stating that *"Advertising on athletes is hardly compatible with the dignity of a very popular and widely practised sport."*

- *Article 212.3.* "A National Ski Association may allow a competitor to receive support beyond the rules laid down in 212.1 and 212.2. All contracts or other arrangements with a commercial firm, organisation or individuals concerning such support shall be approved by the National Ski Association concerned. This shall be communicated to the FIS Bureau forthwith. Such competitors may start in the FIS Calendar races if they conform with all other rules of eligibility of the FIS, but they risk not being permitted to start in Olympic Games."

- 1983 will get off to a flying start as far as the Ladies' Cross Country Ski Committee (LCCC) is concerned, for in the first week of January they

are holding their 25th meeting in Klingenthal/Mühlleiten (GDR). This jubilee also coincides with the 25th anniversary of the GDR Ski Federation and an international technical delegates' seminar for women.

The LCCC holds regular committee and working group meetings during which it draws up proposals to be submitted to the FIS Council and to the International Ski Congress, to be staged this year from 8th to 15th May in Sydney (AUS). The LCCC plays a very special role in promoting women's cross-country skiing. It began as a little-known body which has successfully helped this sport gain full recognition and equality with the corresponding men's event.

Amongst the proposals recently forwarded to the FIS Council were technical questions such as "ski-skating technique", doping, World Cup rules and so on, as well as other matters specifically related to women - new race distances as of 1984/5 and femininity regulations. Meanwhile, the agenda for the LCCC's January meeting contains such items as rules, long-distance races, equipment and nomination of officials.

The LCCC has obviously so far made giant strides in fulfilling its task of aiding the development of women's cross-country skiing.
