

# Obituary

*With great sadness, we have learned of the deaths of these defenders of the Olympic movement.*

**Antonio Attanasio** (ITA) aged 33, an Italian swimming champion in the 100 metres freestyle, who took part in the Games of the XIXth Olympiad in Mexico in 1968.

**Shen Chai-Ming** (TPE) aged 67, President of the “Chinese Taipei Olympic Committee” and of the “Chinese Taipei Ski Association”. He contributed much to the development of skiing in his country and directed the efforts of the FIS towards the promotion of skiing all over the world.



**Mrs. Alma Camper** (AUT) aged 71, mother-in-law of Maurice Herzog, IOC Member in France.

**Mr. Alhagi Muhammed O. Jannah** (GAM). Secretary General of the Gambia National Olympic Committee.

**Harry Jérôme** (CAN) aged 42, one of the best sprinters of this century, and holder of the world record for the 100 metres flat race from 1960-1968. Winner of a bronze medal at the Olympic Games in Tokyo in 1964, he also won a gold medal at the Empire Games in 1966 and at the Panamerican Games in 1967. He was an Officer of the Order of Canada and a Member of the Temples of Fame in Canada, British Columbia and of Canadian Athletics.

**Mr. Allao O. C. McGavin** (CAN) aged 72, member of the Canadian Olympic Association, of the Canadian Association of the Commonwealth Games and of the Committee of the Panamerican Games. He had devoted many years to the promotion of Olympism in Canada. An Officer of the Order of Canada, Doctor Honoris Causa in Law of the University of British Columbia, Chancellor of the University of British Columbia, Director of many companies, he also played an important role within various charitable organizations.

**Eino Penttilä** (FIN) aged 76, who was the world record holder for the javelin throw, and won a bronze medal at the Olympic Games in Los Angeles in 1932.

**Willy Schaerer**, (SUI) aged 79, winner of a silver medal for the 1500 metres at the Olympic Games in Paris, in 1924.

**Hans Schwarzeatruher** (SUI) aged 53, who took part in the Olympic Games in Helsinki in 1952 and in Rome in 1960 as a member of the national gymnastics team.

**Antonio Siddi** (ITA) aged 60, winner of a bronze medal in the 4 x 100 m. relay in the 1948 Olympic Games in London.

**Edward Westerlund** (FIN) aged 81, a world wrestling champion in 1922 in the 67 kg category, and a gold medalist in Greco-Roman wrestling (75 kg) at the Olympic Games in Paris in 1924.



**Percy O. C. Williams** (CAN) aged 74, winner of a gold medal in athletics for the 100 metres and the 200 metres at the 1928 Olympic Games in Amsterdam. He was an Officer of the Order of Canada and a Member of the Temples of Fame in Canada, British Columbia and of Canadian Athletics.

**Juan Carlos Zabala** (ARG) aged 72, Olympic Champion in the Marathon at the 1932 Games in Los Angeles.
