### BOBSLEIGH AND TOBOGGANING



- The next FIBT Congress will take place on 4th and 5th July 1984 in Calgary (CAN).

set annually. The sum in question shall be communicated to the FIAC which, having taken due note thereof, shall inform all affiliated federations.

In addition to providing health, food and family facilities for the athletes, national federations shall also ensure that arrangements be made to provide the athletes with the assistance stipulated in IOC Rule N° 26 and shall help them to settle into their professional activities.

Art. 9 a - Pursuant to the Olympic Rules, competitors' names shall have reached the organisation 10 days prior to the beginning of the first event of each sport.

No change of programme shall be admitted except in the case of an act of God. In such cases, all team managers shall be informed at least 12 hours beforehand.

In the case of bad weather, postponement shall be immediately announced over the public address system and shall be confirmed in writing, together with an indication of when the races will be restarted.

Riders in all disciplines shall be granted a training period not exceeding 5 minutes between two track events.

Protective helmets shall be worn in all Olympic road and track ev/ents."

### CYCLING

- Modifications made to the regulations of the International Amateur Cycling Federation during its Congress which took place last November in Paris (FRA) :

Art. 9 - (p. 25) Delete and replace by :

"Art. 9 - To be permitted to participate in the Olympic Games, an athlete shall :

- hold a licence issued by a FIAC - affiliated national federation,
- be or attain 17 years of age in the calendar year of the Games,
- observe and respect the FIAC Regulations and IOC Rule No 26 along with its application rider and instructions in accordance with the Annex to the FIAC Technical Regulations,
- not have accepted prizes in cash or kind (items of value) in excess of the amounts hereafter specified. The maximum value of prizes in cash or kind for individual races or for each stage of stage races and for track races shall be

## WEIGHTLIFTING



- The *IWF Executive Board, the Technical, Medical, Scientific and Research Committees* recently held their meetings in Nuremberg. The main item on the agenda of all the meetings was the *elaboration of a complete draft of the IWF Constitution and Technical Rules*, modified according to the proposals of the National Federations and to be approved by the IWF Congress in Los Angeles. The complete draft thus modernised and up-dated according to the requirements of the developing weightlifting sport shall be available in book-form for each affiliated National Federation of the IWF in due time before the Congress for study.

At the same time - following a proposal of the Medical Committee and the Special Doping Commission - the IWF Executive Board took a firm standpoint, i.e. the IWF will submit to a *doping control each major international weightlifting competition prior to the Los Angeles Olympic Games* and the samples shall be checked in the doping laboratories approved by the IOC. Those lifters eventually caught taking forbidden drugs at these events shall be disqualified and *suspended by the IWF for a period of two years.*

The Executive Board further decided that any weightlifter found to have taken forbidden drugs at the *Los Angeles Olympic Games shall be suspended for life.*
