



TWELVE INTERNATIONAL SPORTS EVENTS IN 1987

In the context of preparations for the Games of the XXIVth Olympiad, twelve international sports events will take place in Korea (KOR) during the course of this year. The disciplines concerned are canoeing, yachting, cycling, the modern pentathlon, the marathon, football, judo, tennis, volleyball, weightlifting and shooting. With the exception of yachting, all the competitions will be held in the Korean capital. Two of them, canoeing and yachting, will be under the patronage of the SLOOC, which will also be giving a hand to the pentathletes and cyclists, the other competitions remaining under the auspices of the

national federations. The 1987 international canoeing regattas will take place on the river Han with the participation of 180 athletes from twenty-eight countries. Some five hundred participants from forty countries will be taking part in the trial Olympic yachting regattas scheduled to take place between 16th and 26th September 1987 at the Olympic yachting centre in Pusan.

Starting with the Marathon World Cup, scheduled for 11th and 12th April 1987, for which a large international field has already entered, the events will take place in rapid succession : in June, the 17th President's Cup football tournament, in early September (4th to 13th) the World Girl's Junior Volleyball Championships, followed by the World Junior Pentathlon Championships from 17th to 22nd with eighty athletes from twenty-five countries. At the same time, two hundred cyclists and officials will be taking part in the Seoul international cycling competition from 18th to 29th September. In October, it will be the turn of the Pro-Specs Junior Tennis Championships and the 1987 International Shooting Cup. The 4th Men's International FIVB Cup will begin the month of November and finally, the Weightlifting World Cup Gala and the Sung Kok international judo competitions in December will see out an exciting year of international sport.
