
SPORTS PANORAMA AROUND THE WORLD

On the occasion of the 92nd Session in Istanbul, just as the special number of the last session was devoted entirely to the inauguration of the Olympic House in Lausanne, this *Olympic Review* publishes pictures of sport gathered from around the world. This world tour begins, of course, with a glimpse of sports in Turkey, which comes to us courtesy of Teoman Güray. Banzouzi Malonga, journalist of the Congolese daily paper *Le Stade*, details the arduous preparations for the third African Games in Nairobi (KEN) for the countries in Zone 4 of the Supreme Sports Council of Africa. In America, we visit Calgary where the Games and the media have recently been the subject of an important congress organized by the university and patronized by the IOC and OCO'88. What makes the Scandinavians run? The Vasaloppet Race held for over 65 years, according to Wolf Lybeg, secretary general of the Swedish NOC.
