



OLYMPIC SCIENTIFIC CONGRESS 1984 : OFFICIAL REPORT SPORT HISTORY, edited by Norbert Müller and Joachim K. Rühl (Niedernhansen. FRG, Schors-Verlag, 1985). 486 pages. Paperback DM 45.—; Cloth DM 58.—

The Official Report of the section "Sport History" was already published in 1985, thus starting the Olympic Scientific Congress series later edited by Human Kinetics Publishers in 10 vols. in the year 1986. The illustrated volume "Sport History" contains 50 scholarly contributions which are subdivided into 14 sections; 48 sport-historians from 16 nations are represented. Although the NOCs from socialist countries did not go the Los Angeles Games, quite a few scholars from these nations made it to Eugene. There are papers from Poland, Bulgaria, Yugoslavia, Czechoslovakia, and the USSR. The USA of course lead the field with 18 papers, followed by the FRC (7),

Great Britain (4), Canada (4), and Australia (4). Areas dealt with are female participation in the Olympic Games, philosophical and psychological considerations, international aspects of athleticism, sport in literature, individuals and events in Olympic history, Greek and Roman sport, the modern Olympic Movement and philosophy, physical culture, aspects of American sport, perspectives on British sport, international aspects of physical education and sport, and of gymnastics and the gymnasium. I. Broekhoff, Chair of the Scientific Program Commission in Eugene had commissioned N. Müller (Mainz) and J. K. Rühl (Cologne) in 1984 with the edition of the sport history papers.

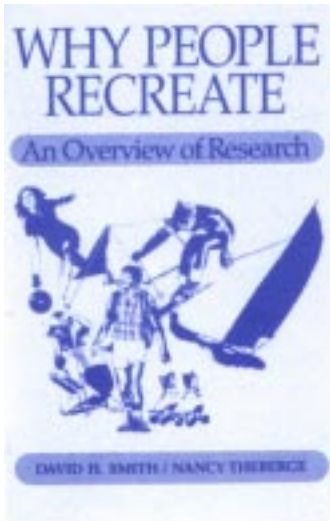

This work is based on a study and detailed analysis of the practice of outdoor sports and recreational activities. The two authors describe in this book the factors which call affect participation in recreational activities, socio-economic factors personality, attitudes to leisure, the socio-historical context etc. The last pages of this book are devoted to a substantial list of references.

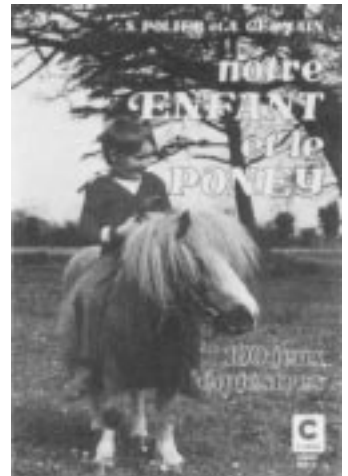

Its also offers all the elements of a complete and progressive course for use by teachers an instructors. Co-author Solange Poller is an international judge in acrobatic riding.

This work consists of eleven texts which analyse physical activity in children from the point of view of history, sociology, psychology and motor development. It presents a summary of the latest knowledge in this field and provides suggestions for future studies whilst constituting an indispensable work of reference.

BRITAIN AND THE OLYMPIC GAMES : REDISCOVERY OF A HERITAGE, by Don Anthony, published by the City of Birmingham, 1986.
