

# INTERNATIONAL FEDERATIONS



## IAAF

The 2nd International Athletic Foundation Symposium on 'Doping in Sport' will be held from 5th to 7th June 1989 in Monte Carlo, Monaco. International experts will lecture on topics such as : the most urgent problems of testing; adverse effects of doping ; current testing procedures ; the work of the doping laboratory in Seoul ; national testing programmes. Representatives of other international sports federations will talk on doping control practice in their sports.

## FISA

Mr. Thomas Keller, FISA President since 1958, pronounced the rowing regatta at the Games in Seoul as excellently organized, fair and of high sporting value from beginning to end. The federation's medal of honour was represented to representatives of the organizing committee Messrs. Shin-Koo Huh and Young-Joon Han, Commissioner and Rowing Director respectively, at the traditional closing ceremony of the events.

FISA's Medal of Honour was also awarded to competitor Pertti Karppinen (FIN) for the exemplary sporting attitude he has shown throughout his whole career. Three times Olympic champion in skiff from 1976 to 1984, he failed to make the finals in Seoul in a boat lent to him by the Brazilian rower Marinho after his own had been damaged. He got a standing ovation nonetheless from the spectators and later came seventh after fighting back to win the final for the minor placings.

□ The rowing federation of the Philippines has become the 66th member of FISA. Other decisions made at FISA's congress held before the Olympic regatta in Seoul, included confirmation of Montreal as the 1992 venue for the World Junior Championships.

□ Mr. Thomas Keller intends to step down from his position as FISA President from autumn 1990. The federations council is to propose to the 1989 congress in Bled (YUG), that he be re-elected until the 1990 World Championships in Lake Barrington (AUS). It will propose Mr. Denis Oswald, Secretary General, as Mr. Keller's future successor. A new Secretary General would then be nominated during 1980

FIFA

The FIFA Fair Play Award for 1988 has been awarded to the German league professional, Mr. Frank Ordenewitz. He was honoured for his sporting behaviour in the German league match between FC Cologne and his team Werder Bremen on 7th May last year. The referee had not noticed that Ordenewitz had touched the ball in his own penalty area and awarded Werder Bremen a corner. After protests by the Cologne players, the referee checked what had happened with Ordenewitz, who admitted hand contact with the ball. Cologne were given a penalty kick and went on to win the match 2-0. Although not all his team-mates approved of his action, Ordenewitz explained that he would do the same thing again as this was in line with his conception of true sport.

Mr. Karl-Heinz Wehr, Secretary General of AIBA, corrects several figures included in the boxing statistics on page 584 of the Seoul Results Special issue. Costa Rica had one boxer competing in the competition and the People's Democratic Republic of Yemen had two. So the final total of participants is 441 from 107 countries and not 439 as stated in the article on page 514. Also, of course, no women competed in the competition, as implied by a tabulation error !

This is only the second such award by FIFA : Dundee United Football Club in Scotland had won the first in 1987. It consists of FS 50,000 and a gold football globe trophy, which were presented to Ordenezwiz on 10th December by Mr. Joseph Blatter, Secretary General of the federation. Mr. Ordenewitz decided that a sports foundation would be set up with the money so that his club can give a Christmas party each year for handicapped and needy children.

Also honoured were the organizers of the Olympic football tournament in Korea last year. This was equally an expression of thanks to the Korean football spectators, who turned out in force in spite of the home team's early elimination and who behaved in an impeccably sporting manner throughout.

## FIVB

Twelve new national federations gained FIVB membership : American Samoa, Papua New Guinea, Tonga, Andorra, Monaco, San Marino, Botswana, Cape Verde, Liberia, Barbados, St. Kitts and St. Vincent. This brings the total affiliated membership to 175 for a sport that now counts 140 million players worldwide.

The Promotion Commission has been replaced by a new Mass Media Commission.

□ Following the initiative of the FIVB and in full collaboration with the COOB'92, the first World TV Seminar to discuss coverage of volleyball will be held in Barcelona on 24th and 25th April 1989. There will be a tour of venues on 26th.

The seminar will include official presentations by the following television networks : Globo, Brazil host broadcaster for the 1990 World Championships ; Asahi, Japan, host broadcaster for the Japan Cup ; Fuji, Japan, host broadcaster for the World Cup; NBC Sports, American broadcaster for the 1988 and 1992 Olympic Games; and Channel 4, United Kingdom. Mr. Ralph Mellanby will represent NBC and Messrs. Adrian Metcalfe and Des Bradley Channel 4.

The XXIst FIVB World Congress was held in Seoul on 14th and 15th September 1988. More than ninety affiliated federations were represented. They elected the board of administration for the 1988-1992 Olympiad : *President*, Mr. Ruben Acosta (re-elected) (MEX) ; *Secretary General*, Mr. Piet De Bruin (HOL); *Treasurer*, Mr. Franz Schmied (SUI) ; *Vice-Presidents*, Messrs. 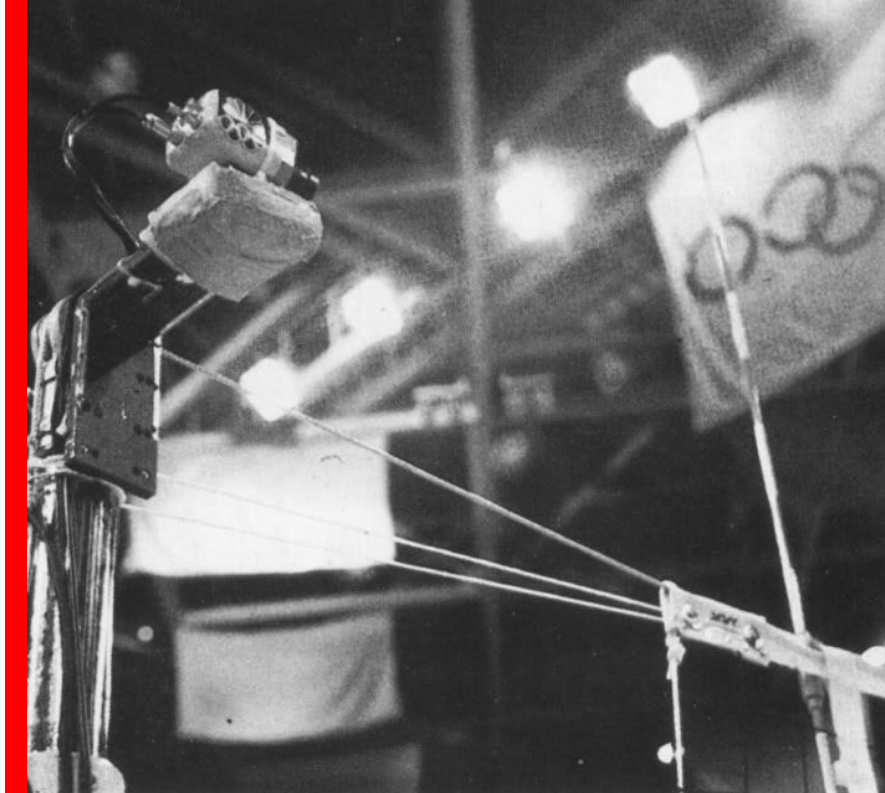
All aspects of the coverage of volleyball will be discussed and guidelines agreed for the best presentation of the game on television, with particular attention paid to statistics and graphics. Mr. Ruben Acosta, FIVB President, is trying to ensure that all future host broadcasters of official FIVB events and the federation's technical representatives are present.

The seminar will run concurrently with the meeting between the IOC and the International Summer Sports Federations. It will be held at the five-star Avenida Hotel. Approximate maximum cost of a single room there is 14,000 pesetas for a single and 26,000 ptas for a double room. Reservations can, of course, be made in other hotels.

□ The School Volleyball Programme is now well under way with the launch of the FIVB School Trophy. During 1986 and 1987, questionnaires were sent out to affiliated federations and then the regulations drafted. The trophy is not a championship or a tournament but a recognition of attempts to promote volleyball and minivolley in schools. Those eligible to enter for this award are ministries of education or governmental bodies with responsibility for sport in schools, national volleyball federations and public or private teaching organizations and associations.

Mr. Ruben Acosta explains why the federation has set up this programme. "The

worlds of school and sport... are both committed to searching for the best conditions to promote a person's motor and sports formation. The FIVB intends to broaden and strengthen its relations with schools... It can make itself available to document, stimulate and improve school volleyball". The federation will work with governmental schools bodies to promote volleyball and minivolley on the physical education curriculum, to encourage sports and cultural exchanges and involve the sport in international meetings and events. It will also collaborate with national volleyball federations or associations in preparing teaching aids and materials and teacher training programmes.
