### IOA EVENTS IN 1991

The 31st Session of the International Olympic Academy will open on 16th July this year and finish on 31st, with its young students reflecting on sport for all.

The academic year will start in May, with, notably, the 8th International Session for members and officials of the NOCs and the IFS (from 12th to 18th), an international symposium organized (from 8th to 12th) by the University of Patras (GRE), a visit of the International Sports Institute and an international FINA water-polo seminar (from 27th May to 3rd June). In June, Olympia will be host to the Danish Olympic Academy and the 6th international seminar for sports journalists. In August, it will be the turn of the FIVB to organize its own meetings (from 2nd to 12th), then there will be, from 14th to 19th, the seminar for young members of the Panellinios Club, the highly regarded Greek club which has just been awarded the Olympic Cup. To end the month, former course students of the IOA who have taken part in a session will meet from 20th to 26th.

September will begin (from 3rd to 7th) with the International Congress of the Sports University of Athens, then the German Olympic Academy will take over the premises from 9th to 14th, before making way for the Greek Basketball Federation, which is organizing a umpires' seminar from 15th to 18th. The FIG has booked afterwards for one of its international seminars. The academic year will finish in October with a International Taekwondo Federation seminar for trainers and judges (from 20th to 26th).

### COMMUNIQUE, OF THE COURT OF ARBITRATION FOR SPORT

In the dispute, submitted to the Court of Arbitration of Sport in 1989, between Compania Peruana de Radiodifusion S.A. and the International Volley-Ball Federation on the subject of a broadcasting contract concluded between them on February 17th, 1987, the Court of Arbitration for Sport, in a panel composed of Messrs Andrés Aramburú-Menchaca and Denis Oswald, arbitrators, and Pierre Lalive, President, has just rendered its final arbitral award.

The Court of Arbitration has established that the termination of the contract by the International Volley-Ball Federation in April 1989 was not valid in that it was not performed in accordance with the terms of the contract, so that the said contract remained in force. Taking into account all the circumstances of the particular case, a partial indemnity has been awarded to Compania Peruana de Radiodifusion S.A. and fixed equitably by the Court of Arbitration in conformity with the applicable rules of Swiss law.
