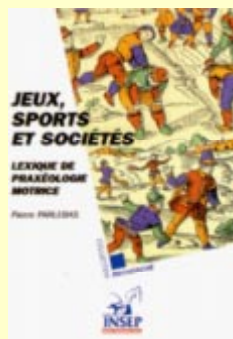
## Jeux, Sports et Sociétés

### - Lexique de praxéologie motrice

("Games, Sports and Societies - Lexicon of motor praxeology") by Pierre Parlebas, published by the National Institute of Sport and Physical Education (INSEP), 11 avenue du Tremblay, 75012 Paris (France). Research Collection. 1999. 472 pages in French. Price: FF 190.- This work is presented in the form of a lexicon giving

access to 150 pieces of information. The author offers a detailed study of games, their structures, interactions and what is being played for. He also answers concrete questions such as: "How do players communicate with their bodies?", "What are the characteristics of the space and the instruments used for

sport?" and "What kinds of social bonds are fostered by the Olympic Games?".

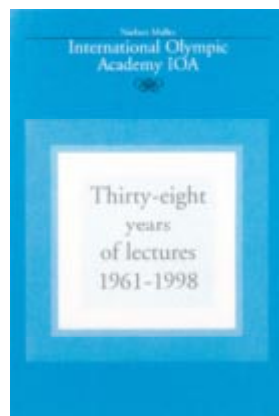


The Olympic Studies Centre has recently published a study by Nikolay Guéorguiev entitled *Quelques anecdotes sur les athlètes olympiques* ("Some anecdotes on Olympic athletes"). It includes: a list of twins and brothers and sisters who have been Olympic athletes; fathers and sons who have participated in the same Olympic Games; parents and children who have won Olympic medals; athletes who have taken part in both the Games of the Olympiad and the Olympic Winter Games; athletes who have won medals at both the Games of the Olympiad and the Olympic Winter Games; the Olympic athletes who have won most medals at the Games of the Olympiad; medals won by countries hosting the Games of the Olympiad and the Olympic Winter Games.

This book compares two strong currents in sports sociology which have arisen from the works of Pierre Bourdieu (theory on the field) and Jean-Marie Brohm (critical theory), and sums up both from a sociological and

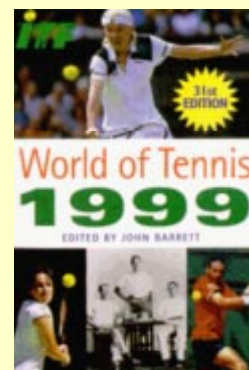
institutional perspective. The author offers a socio-historical reading of the development of sports sociology and defines themes for research drawn from the two models.
