The following specific topics have been selected for consideration at Conference '86.

HISTORY : Sport and Imperialism; Sport and the Commonwealth; Sport and Nationalism; Sport and Ethics; Sport and Urbanisation; Sport, Recreation and Leisure.

SOCIOLOGY : Sport, Hegemony, Control and Dominance; Sport, Social Systems and Social Structures; Sport. Sport, Leisure and Class; Inequality and Under-representation; Sport, Violence, Conflict and Aggression; Sport, Emigration and Immigration.

Both Perspectives will have an Open Section

PRESENTATIONS

The total number of papers presented in the History and Sociology component of the Conference will be sixty-six (thirty-three in Sociology). There will be three invited Major Addresses (of one hour duration each) in each Perspective. The remainder of the presentations will last for thirty minutes. This will leave time for questions and discussion. The time schedule will be strictly adhered to in the interests of all contributors.

TOPICS

It is hoped that the Conference will offer an opportunity *inter alia* to further understanding of the role of sport within imperial and commonwealth settings, particularly in relation to the attempted inculcation of moral values, the creation of urban leisure and recreational facilities, the development of national identity, and the fostering of international links and ties. In short, it is hoped that the relationships of sport to concepts such as social cohesion, contend and disassociation will be fully and fruitfully explored. In addition, consideration might well be given to the interrelation between sport and imperial propaganda, to class variation in sports activities within empire and commonwealth, to the part that athletic rituals and symbols have played in the creation of 'invented tradition' of both working and middle classes, and to the role that sport has played within 'popular culture' as a whole.

However, the topics of the conference offer the fullest opportunity to cover a wide range of issues and with the inclusive of the Open Sections no historical and sociological issue is excluded from consideration by the Presentations Committees.
