A.S.S.H. STUDENT ESSAY AND DISSERTATION PRIZES

A.S.S.H. awards two prizes annually for quality work by tertiary or secondary students in the general field of sports culture. Appropriate areas of focus are: sport and economics, sport in history, law, literature, philosophy, politics, social psychology and sociology. Sports culture and tradition should be seen as being broad, not confined.

The A.S.S.H. Dissertation Prize will be awarded to an Honours thesis written in 1990 or 1991. One (returnable) copy should be submitted. The prize is \$100 and a one year subscription to A.S.S.H. Other prizes may be awarded at the discretion of the judging panel. The winning dissertations may be published as an A.S.S.H. Study in Sports History.

The **A.S.S.H. Essay Prize** will be awarded to an essay written in 1990 or 1991. Two copies should be submitted. The prize is \$100 and a one year subscription to A.S.S.H. Other prizes may be awarded at the discretion of the judging panel. The winning essay will be published in the A.S.S.H. *Bulletin*.
