The Most Striking Incidents in the Daily Games of the Big Leagues, Covering Approximately the Fourth Month of the Playing Season.

July 16.

St. Louis took a double header from the Highlanders, 5 to 1 and 3 to 1.

Johnson defeated the White Sox, Washington scoring 7 runs to 2 for Chicago.

Collins of the Red Sox defeated Detroit, 7 to 2, though Cobb made his usual 2 hits, one of them a triple.

Lavender defeated the Giants, 3 to 1.

July 17.

Detroit split a double header with the Athletics, winning the first game 13 to 1, losing the second, 5 to 4.

Cobb made 3 two baggers and a single in the first game, and a triple and 2 singles in the second. Moriarity made 4 hits in the first game. Stanage 4 hits in the second.

July 18.

Boston split a double header with Cincinnati, winning the first game, 8 to 2, and losing the second, 7 to 1.

The Phillies did the same with Chicago. Maroney of the Cubs lost the first game, 8 to 9. Reulbach won the second, 4 to 2, holding the Phillies to 6 hits.

July 22.

Pittsburg shut out Boston 2 to 0. Camnitz held the Braves to 6 hits. The Giants easily defeated Cincinnati 4 to 1, Mathewson pitching.

New York defeated the White Sox 13 to 3. The Highlanders incidentally made 13 hits.

The Athletics defeated St. Louis 15 to 4. Lord and Collins both made 4 runs.

Washington with Johnson pitching defeated Detroit 5 to 3. Johnson struck out 10 men.

July 24.

The Giants defeated Cincinnati 8 to 7 in a 10 inning game.

Cleveland, with Gregg pitching, defeated the Red Sox 11 to 6.

The Highlanders defeated Chicago 4 to 3. Chase made 4 hits in 4 times at bat.

Chicago defeated Brooklyn 5 to 1, Cheney pitching.

July 25.

Cleveland shut out Boston 1 to 0. Gregg held the Red Sox to 4 hits.

Chicago defeated the Highlanders, 6 to 4. Daniels made 4 hits in 4 times at bat.

The Athletics split a double header with St. Louis, winning the first, 3 to 2, and losing the second, 4 to 3.

Pittsburg defeated Brooklyn, 8 to 7 in a 14 inning contest.

July 26.

Philadelphia defeated Pittsburg, 4 to 1. Moore held the Pirates to 6 hits, 3 of them by Wagner.

Reulbach added another victory to Chicago, the Giants, with Mathewson pitching, losing by the score of 4 to 3.

July 28.

Washington took both ends of a double header with Cleveland, 4 to 1 and 3 to 2.

The Highlanders did the same to St. Louis. Mullin proved too much for Coombs, and the Detroit won over the Athletics, 8 to 4.

July 29.

The Cubs continued their winning streak at the expense of the Giants, and Reulbach again proved a life saver to Richie in the 8th inning. The game was lost by the Giants through a hard hit drive of Herzog hitting the umpire's coat tails. This little incident prevented two runs and decided the game.

Brooklyn defeated Cincinnati, 2 to 1, Rucker responsible.

Plank defeated Detroit, 7 to 6.

July 30.

Mathewson defeated the Cubs, 10 to 4, taking the only game of the series.

Cincinnati defeated Brooklyn, 5 to 4. Both sides made 12 hits.

July 31.

The Giants shut out Cincinnati, 7 to 0. Ames pitched a good game.

St. Louis split a double header with Philadelphia.

Brennan won the second game by a shut out, allowing the Cardinals only 2 hits.

August 1.

Pittsburg shut out Boston, 1 to 0.

Hendrix officiated, allowing the Braves but 3 hits.

The Giants took a double header from Cincinnati, 5 to 4 and 7 to 5

O'Brien of the Red Sox held St. Louis to 3 hits, but lost the game, 2 to 1.

August 4.

Boston defeated Cleveland, 8 to 6. Jackson made 4 hits in 5 times at bat, including 2 doubles. Gardner also made 4 hits.

The Tigers defeated New York, 4 to 1. Cobb made 2 triples in 3 times at bat.

Hughes and Johnson held Chicago to 2 hits, and Washington won against Walsh by the score of 3 to 2.

August 5.

Washington again defeated Chicago, 8 to 7. The Senators made 16 hits. Both sides used 3 pitchers.

The Giants defeated Cincinnati, 12 to 6. Snodgrass made 4 hits in 5 times at bat and scored 3 runs.

The Cardinals shut out Philadelphia, Harmon allowing 6 hits.

August 6.

No shut out games to-day. Pittsburg defeated New York 7 to 2, but the Cubs failed to gain since Philadelphia was taking their measure 6 to 1.

Cincinnati succeeded in defeating Boston by the score of 6 to 3. Marsans, the Cuban star, made 3 hits, scored 2 runs and stole a base.

The White Sox defeated Washington 2 to 1 in a pitchers' battle between Groom and White, although Chicago made but 4 hits.

Boston with Wood pitching defeated Cleveland 5 to 4 in an 11 inning game. Griggs made 4 hits in 5 times at bat.

August 7.

Detroit shut out New York 7 to 0. Dubuc held the Highlanders to 2 hits.

Washington, with Johnson pitching, defeated the White Sox 10 to 1. Gandil made a three bagger and a home run.

August 8.

Boston shut out Detroit 5 to 0, Collins pitching. St. Louis shut out Washington 8 to 0, Hamilton pitching.

In a pitchers' battle between Marquard and

Hendrix, the Giants won over Pittsburg in the 10th inning 2 to 1.

Lavender defeated the Phillies 7 to 4. Sallee opposed Rucker and St. Louis won over Brooklyn 2 to 1.

August 11th.

Philadelphia took a double-header from the White Sox, 9 to 6 and 2 to 1. Strunk made 4 hits in 4 times at bat in the first game.

Johnson held St. Louis to 4 hits, and Washington won 3 to 2.

Dubuc won for Detroit over the Red Sox, 4 to 2.

August 12th.

St. Louis defeated the Giants 8 to 6, making 16 hits off Ames and Mathewson.

Cincinnati defeated Philadelphia 2 to 1.

August 13th.

The Highlanders defeated Detroit 3 to 2. Cobb made 2 hits in 3 times at bat.

Reulbach pitched against Perdew, and the Cubs won 4 to 2 over the Braves.

Cincinnati defeated Philadelphia 7 to 6, although the Phillies made 15 hits. McGee alone made 4 hits in 5 times at bat.

August 14th.

Philadelphia took a double-header from Cleveland, 8 to 3 and 2 to 0. Bender won the first game and Plank the second.

Philadelphia lost a double-header to Pittsburg, 2 to 3 and 1 to 3, respectively. Camnitz and Hendrix were the winning pitchers.

The Red Sox took a double-header from St. Louis, 8 to 2 and 8 to 0. Wood won the shut-out game.
