

# HAWKEYES WIN CHAMPIONSHIP

EVANSTON, Ill., Nov. 19—The University of Iowa football eleven today plowed its way through a mud covered and rain soaked field to the Western Conference Championship and to the championship of the middle-west by defeating Northwestern, 14 to 0.

The best pass of the day came in the first four minutes of play and brought the Hawkeyes their first score. After working the ball down to the Purple's 85 yard line, Aubrey Devine shot a pretty pass to his brother Glenn, who went 20 yards to a touchdown.

## HAWKEYES WIN ANOTHER GAME IN TITLE FIGHT

Lafayette, Ind., Oct. 29—A. Devine Iowa's star quarterback put his team out in front of Purdue after a hard struggle on a muddy football field here this afternoon. The final score being 13 to 6 in favor of the Hawkeyes. Iowa scored its first touchdown at the opening of the second quarter when Aubrey Devine sent a pass to Belding behind the Purdue goal. Devine kicked the goal following the touchdown. The second Iowa marker came in the third period when Devine caught a short punt and ran thirty yards through the Purdue team. He failed to kick goal.

### Captain Devine Scores Five Touchdowns; Locke A Big Factor.

Iowa City, Ia., Nov. 12.—Iowa added another victory to its string today, winning easily from Indiana, 41 to 0. At no time was Iowa's goal in danger. Captain A. Devine scored five of Iowa's touchdowns before being taken out in the third period. Gordon Locke made Iowa's sixth touchdown.

Iowa won the toss and chose to defend the south goal with a stiff wind favoring them. Iowa scored its first touchdown early when Indiana fumbled and Thompson recovered on Iowa's 19-yard line. A. Devine circled the Indiana right end for a touchdown, and later kicked goal. A 27-yard run by A. Devine netted the second touchdown. A. Devine kicked goal. A left end run netted a third touchdown for Iowa in the first period. A. Devine failed to kick goal.

#### THIRD PERIOD.

A forward pass, A. Devine to his brother Glenn, netted Iowa 17 yards, placing the ball on Indiana's four yard line. A. Devine went around the Indiana left end for the fifth touchdown.

## HAWKEYES WIN OVER ILLINOIS IN GRIM BATTLE

Iowa, City, Ia., Oct. 15.—Iowa triumphed over Illinois in their annual football game here today by a score of 14 to 2. Iowa's victory over Illinois, on top of the win last week over Notre Dame, puts the Hawkeye team in position for western conference championship honors. Iowa's touchdowns' coming in the second and third periods, were carried over Illinois' goal line by Fullback Locke. Illinois scored its only points in the final period on a safety.

Iowa's victory was well earned. It came from two touchdowns by Gordon Locke, plunging fullback of Coach Howard Jones' machine. One was scored in the second period and the other in the third. Locke's gains also were largely instrumental in putting Iowa in position to score.

## DEVINE'S GREAT WORK CRUSHES GOPHER ELEVEN

Minneapolis, Minn., Nov. 5.—Iowa wrecked Minnesota's homecoming here today, winning 41 to 7, but the one touchdown gave the Maroon and Gold supporters a real thrill, as a forty-five yard forward pass from Martineau landed in Cole's arms for a touchdown. The Minnesota defense could not check Iowa's plunging and the end running of A. Devine, who with Shuttleworth, Locke and G. Devine, gained almost at will. Iowa's passing game was also successful.

Iowa scored a touchdown against Minnesota in the first period, the score coming after both teams had tried the, opponent's defense. On an effective change of punts, Minnesota took the ball on her 20-yard line, where a pass was intercepted by Shuttleworth who carried the ball to the eight-yard line. A. Devine went over on the next play. Goal was kicked.

With three minutes left to play and the ball on Minnesota's 17-yard line, A. Devine shot a pass to Belding, who crossed the line with a Minnesota tackler clutching him. Devine kicked goal, making the score 14 to 0.

Minnesota was unable to check Iowa's attack in the third period, A. Devine's open field running being directly responsible for one touchdown and Belding's dash with an intercepted pass from midfield to Minnesota's 15-yard line paving the way for another touchdown by A. Devine, who kicked both goals. Minnesota's play was ragged and Iowa again suffered from penalties. Score: Iowa 28; Minnesota 0. Minnesota's defense could not withstand the Iowa attack in the last period, A. Devine going over for two touchdowns.
